Biographical Sketch

Keith Ralston received his B.A. (1942) and M.A. (1965) in history from the University of British Columbia. He taught at Templeton Secondary School until 1960 when he was appointed curator of the Maritime Museum. In 1967, he joined the Department of History at UBC and has become particularly noted for his work in B.C. history.

Scope and Content
