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Fonds Description

International House fonds. – 1951-1986.

3.78 m of textual records. ca. 100 photographs.

Administrative History

Established in 1953, the International House Club was formed by an amalgamation of the International Students' Club and the International House Committee. In 1954, the University assigned the Club an army hut in Acadia Camp, and local service clubs donated money, labour, and furnishings. The Club undertook a fund-raising project to erect its own building. With a sizable donation from the Vancouver Rotary Club and a site donated by the University, International House began construction in 1958. The following year Eleanor Roosevelt opened International House. In 1964, the International House Association - B.C. Chapter was amalgamated with International House. International House carries out a number of programmes, both by itself and together with other institutions and government bodies, and plays host to many student organizations and events. These programmes and services have sought to ensure that students from abroad are adequately oriented toward the University and the community and that Canadian students also benefit from broadened international experience.

Scope and Content

The fonds consists of correspondence, reports, minutes, publications and clippings, financial records, and photographs. The materials are arranged in the following series, according to a block-numeric system established at International House in 1972: 10.000 - History, Objectives, and Policies; 11.000 - Administration; 12.000 - Services and Programmes; 13.000 - U.B.C. Campus Organizations; 14.000 - Vancouver Area Organizations; and 15.000 - Canadian and International Organizations.

Fonds consists of institutional records – access requests must be reviewed by the University's FOIPOP Coordinator.

The materials have been arranged according to a block-numeric central filing system established at International House in 1972 (see file # 1-19 "Filing Code"). Files not

bearing these numeric codes have been placed in the order in which they most likely would have been filed according to the filing system.

Further accruals are expected.

Other records relating to International House can be found in the International House Association, British Columbia Chapter, the International House Collection (William Black, collector), and the International House Collection (Stanley Read, collector).

Series Descriptions

History, Objectives, and Policies series. – 1951-1976.

21 cm of textual records. ca. 100 photographs.

Originally numbered 10.000. Series consists of records relating to the organizational history of International House, and includes reports, minutes, clippings, correspondence, and photographs. Also included are copies of the International House constitution and amendments, and the office filing code.

Administration series. – 1955-1986.

1.89 m of textual records.

Originally numbered 11.000. Series consists of records relating to the administration of International House and its services, and includes correspondence, reports, minutes, publications (mainly newsletters), budgets and other financial records, and room booking calendars.

Services and Programmes series. – 1960-1985.

99 cm of textual records.

Originally numbered 12.000. Series consists of records documenting the services and programmes offered by International House, including reception and orientation for newly-arrived foreign students, translation and English coaching services, arranging for housing and employment, trips and excursions, and hosting parties, lectures, and other special events. Materials include correspondence, reports, minutes, and financial records.

U.B.C. Campus Organizations series. – 1960-1978.

18 cm of textual records.

Originally numbered 13.000. Series consists of records relating to University offices and organizations, and includes correspondence, and clippings and other published materials.

Vancouver Area Organizations series. – 1963-1979.

11 cm of textual records.

Originally numbered 14.000. Series consists of records relating to institutions and organizations based in the Vancouver area and their relationships with International

House, and includes correspondence, reports, minutes, and clippings and other published materials.

Canadian and International Organizations series. – 1963-1979. 40 cm of textual records.

Originally numbered 15.000. Series consists of records documenting the involvement of International House with Canadian and international organizations, programes, and events, including CBIE (Canadian Bureau of International Education), and Contact Canada (a home-stay programme for Canadian and foreign students). Materials include correspondence, reports, minutes, and clippings and other published materials.
