# OSCAR HENRY SOLIBAKKE PAPERS: An Inventory of the Records

Oscar Henry Solibakke (1885-1964) was associated with gold mining in British Columbia from 1926 until his death. As fiscal agent for the Cariboo Gold Quartz Mining Company he was largely responsible for the successful promotion of the Company's stock between 1927 and 1934. His advertising efforts and the financial success of the Company helped to advance the Cariboo Mining District to the status of a proven lode-gold region and played a significant role in the "Second Cariboo Gold Rush" of the 1930s. Solibakke was also active in promoting and directing several other gold properties during the 1930s and 1940s, notably the Cariboo-Hudson Gold Mines, the Cariboo-Amalgamated Gold Mines, and the Pine Grove Placers.

Mining promotion is a mercurial business and is highly dependent on public attitudes and advertising as well as the merits of the mineral claims and the performance of the companies involved. The advertising and correspondence contained in this collection provides an in debth look into gold promotions in particular and the British Columbia mining industry in general.

The papers in this collection consist of the records of Solibakke's Seattle, Washington, office, including correspondence, advertising, clippings files, photographs, maps, books, and pamphlets. The collection compliments and augments existing collections - The Cariboo Gold Quartz Records in the Special Collections Division of the the University of British Columbia Library, The Cariboo Gold Quartz Records in the Vancouver City Archives, and the Fred Marshall Wells Papers in the Public Archives of British Columbia.
