- KEEP MOVING: It is illegal to stand on a picket line. Walk slowly back and forth across your gate entrance and exit. (Concentrate on entrance.)
- STOP CARS: A constantly moving picket line will stop most cars. One picket should be delegated to hand out leaflets and tell drivers and passengers that ours is a legal picket line and ask them not to cross.
- KEEP A LIST OF LICENCE NUMBERS: Any drivers who speed through lines should be reported, with their licence numbers, to your Sub-coordinator. The same should be done for members of any union crossing our picket lines.
- DON'T GET RUN OVER: Keep an eye out for speeders coming in your direction.
- LIGHT YOURSELVES: When possible at night, park a car behind picket lines with lights on. This slows traffic and gives you some light. All cars must be off the road. Other forms of lighting can be arranged where this is not possible.
- KEEP STRIKE HEADQUARTERS INFORMED: If the R.C.M.P. question you or you have any other problems, tell your Sub-coordinator and the matter will be dealt with.
- PICKET PASSES: If members of other unions inquire about special passes to cross picket lines, tell them to see their own union who will decide on the matter and contact our Strike Committee.
- ENJOY YOURSELVES: We are all sisters and brothers together on a picket line. There is no rule against singing, joking, and having a bit of a good time, even in the rain.
