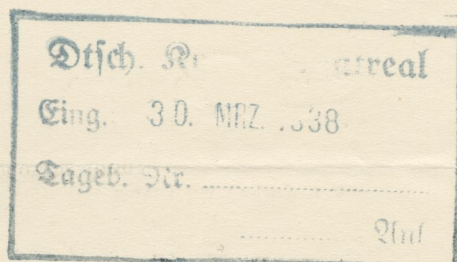

GOVERNMENT NOTICE

DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORT

RADIO REGULATIONS

PART II

EFFECTIVE April 1, 1938, Radio Regulation 31, is hereby cancelled and the following substituted therefor:

31. (1) Private Receiving Station Licences—

(a) Private receiving station licences may be granted for stations established or to be established for reception only of broadcasting as defined in "The Canadian Broadcasting Act, 1936," at places served by an electric distribution system or in automobiles.

(b) Each licence granted under (a) shall permit the installation and operation of one only radio receiving set at the place specified in the licence, or in an automobile.

(2) Special Private Receiving Station Licences—

(a) Special private receiving station licences may be granted for stations established or to be established for reception only of broadcasting defined as aforesaid at places not served by an electric distribution system.

(b) Each licence granted under (a) shall permit the installation and operation of one only battery operated radio receiving set at the place specified in the licence.

(3) General—

(a) No person shall install or operate more than one radio receiving set except under and in accordance with a licence granted by the Minister in respect of each such set.

(b) No radio receiving set shall be operated so as to emit any radiation which interferes with reception by other radio receiving sets.

(c) No person shall sell any radio receiving set to any person for installation or operation until the purchaser has produced for inspection by the vendor his licence to operate such set.

(d) No person shall service a radio receiving set until the owner thereof produces to such person his licence to operate such set.

(e) Every manufacturer of radio apparatus shall affix in a prominent place on every radio receiving set before it leaves his factory a notice in the following form:

WARNING—Any person installing or operating this radio receiving set without having first obtained a licence from the Minister of Transport of Canada is liable to be prosecuted and sentenced to a penalty not exceeding fifty dollars and costs or three months' imprisonment.
