Re: Cross-Local Occupational Health & Safety Committee, 1980/81

Dear Members:

The 7th Annual Convention of AUCE Provincial passed the following resolution:

"AUCE Provincial shall strike a Cross-Local Health and Safety Committee to investigate the occupational health and safety issues that affect university and college employees and to develop policy in regard to this issue, a rep (is to be) elected by each local; and, that the Provincial Association shall oppose any attempt by either the Federal or Provincial governments to undermine policies or programmes in this area; and, the Cross-Local (Occupational Health and Safety) Committee shall report to the Provincial Executive who will publish the findings for the Provincial Association membership."

Your Local Representatives to the Provincial Executive have been asked to announce at the General Membership meetings that nominations are now open for Local Reps on the Cross-Local Occupational Health and Safety Committee.

Some Locals have already done this, and in fact have elected their reps. I have also spoken with Local Executive members and reminded them that the nominations are now open and that the Committee will be starting up very soon.

The first meeting of the CLOH & S Committee will take place on Wednesday, October 15, 1980 at 7:30 p.m. If your local has elected a rep to serve on the Committee please inform them of the first meeting. If your local has any nominees for the Committee, any and all of them are entitled and welcome to attend. While the Convention stipulated that 'a rep' is to be elected, the Committee isn't restricted to that number - although voting will be limited to those elected to represent their respective locals, unless the committee decides otherwise.

Areas of concern to our membership, which I expect will form the basis for research and discussion leading to the policies will undoubtedly include: Stress, back injuries, toxic chemicals in use on the job, safety in the use and maintenance of office equipment and light and heavy machinery, Video Display Terminals, alcoholism on the job, unsafe working conditions and Workers' Compensation Board policy. We will of course investigate Federal and Provincial Legislation affecting all jobs in AUCE's jurisdiction.

Another area of concern for the Committee might include a cross-local comparison of contract clauses concerning sick-leave benefits, health and dental plans and long-term disability plans available to AUCE members.
