## Administrative history / Biographical sketch

---

### Note

Ujjal Dosanjh, born September 9, 1947 in the village of Dosanh Kalan, Jalandhar India, is a former Canadian Federal and Provincial politician. Spending his early years in India, he attended a small primary school established by his maternal grandfather, Moola Singh Bahawal. Both Bahawal and Dosanjh's father were heavily involved in Indian politics. The former prominently fought for India's freedom from British rule; while the latter championed for positive change in the volatile post-war era. At the age of 17, Dosanjh immigrated to England to learn English. There he found work as an assistant editor for a Punjabi language newspaper but was unable to gain acceptance to a British university given their prerequisite requirements. Due to this setback, he decided to move on to Canada where his aunt had been living since 1954. Arriving in Vancouver in 1968, he was hired first as a cleaner for Burke Lumber before moving on to work the physically demanding green chain of their sawmill. At night he also attended classes at Vancouver Community College. The following year Dosanjh badly injured his back in an unfortunate incident at the sawmill. A spinal fusion was required to repair the damage leaving him unable to work labour intensive jobs. After a period of recovery, he dedicated himself to his studies; he enrolled as a full-time student at Langara College in 1971, then transferred to Simon Fraser University in 1972, and graduated with a BA in political science in August of 1973. The following month he began his law education at the University of British Columbia (UBC). As a student, he was highly involved in civil rights and local community issues. Causes he would continue to campaign for throughout his life. Dosanjh successfully completed his degree in 1976 at UBC, going on to establish a private practice in 1979, Dosanjh & Pirani, specializing in family and personal injury law. Through this period, he volunteered at local colleges and schools to teach English to new immigrants; and worked with the British Columbia Civil Liberties Association to co-found both the Labour Advocacy and Research Association and the Farm Workers Legal Information Service. These institutions would serve as the foundations for the creation of the Canadian Farm Workers' Union.

Dosanjh has been a prominent and vocal advocate against violence and extremism. He has for many years spoken out against those who use these means to attempt to establish a Sikh homeland in India called Khalistan. This position has caused friction within the BC Punjabi community resulting in numerous serious threats by mail and in person. The most significant event happened on February 8, 1985 when he was violently assaulted outside of the Dosanjh & Pirani law office in south Vancouver. A masked man wielding an iron bar spiked with a metal bolt inflicted serious injuries resulting in significant head wounds and a severely broken right hand.

The 1979 provincial election was Dosanjh's introduction to British Columbia's political landscape. Running as the New Democratic Party (NDP) candidate in the riding of Vancouver South, his campaign was ultimately unsuccessful. A second attempt in 1981 again failed. However, ten years later in the 1991 B.C. general election he was victorious in the newly formed riding of Vancouver-Kensington. His success coincided with the NDP, under leader Mike Harcourt, achieving the premiership. 1995 proved to be a breakthrough year for Dosanjh's political career. First, he was elevated from a backbencher to the cabinet of the premier as Minister of Government Services and Minister Responsible for Sports, Multiculturalism, Human Rights, and Immigration. Then in August he was appointed Attorney General of BC. Under his tenure from 1995 to 2000, Dosanjh advocated for greater equality for gays and lesbians, combated violence against women, argued for restorative justice, and oversaw the armed confrontation between the aboriginal Secwepemc Nation and the RCMP in an incident known as the Gustafsen Lake Standoff. In the 1996 provincial election, re-election was won in Vancouver-Kensington and the NDP remained in control of the province's politics.

Dosanjh continued to face opposition and receive threats from those advocating for the use of violence to pursue the Khalistan movement. This was again obvious when, as a member of the Legislative Assembly of British Columbia and the Attorney General in 1999, his constituency office was broken into and a burning Molotov cocktail was left on a table as a threat.

Also in 1999, sitting BC premier Glen Clark was ensnarled by accusations involving undue influence in the review of a neighbour's casino licence application. Dosanjh, as Attorney General, was required to cooperate and assist the investigation, therefore privy to specialized knowledge. Clark was forced to resign and new NDP leadership elections were set for early 2000. A successful campaign was launched for the vacant position. Subsequently on February 24, 2000, Ujjal Dosanjh was appointed Premier of B.C., the first Indo-Canadian to do so.

Premier until June 2001, he focused on balancing the provincial budget and advocating for social justice. However, the deeply unpopular position of the provincial NDP party, due to a series of political missteps, led to a sweeping rout in the general election of 2001. The BC Liberal party was resoundingly victorious leading to a return to private life practicing law with his two sons, Aseem and Pavel, at his new firm Dosanjh Woolley.

2004 saw a return to politics with a new political affiliation, the Liberal Party of Canada; and in a new capacity, the federal electoral district of Vancouver South. A winning campaign coincided with a Liberal federal victory, thus leading to his appointment as Minister of Health by Prime Minister Paul Martin. Dosanjh strongly supported Canada's publicly funded health care, working to prevent the provinces from privatizing the system. He occupied the position from 2004 to 2006. The Liberal party was defeated in the 2006 federal election, however Dosanjh once again won his riding. He joined his party as the Official Opposition, serving as the critic for National Defence and served on the Standing Committee on Foreign Affairs and International Development. Re-elected in the 2008 federal election he continued to be the Liberal's critic for National Defence. A campaign for a fourth consecutive term was launch in 2011 but resulted in defeat and retirement from politics. Dosanjh returned to private life and continues to actively advocate against violence and extremism.

## Scope and content

---

The fonds consists of Ujjal Dosanjh's private records from 1977 to 2015, comprising of all aspects of Dosanjh's life in Canada. A prominent portion relates to his lifelong advocacy of Indo-Canadian issues. Particular matters addressed include Sikh extremism, the Khalistan movement, the bombing of Air India flight 182, and the Komagata Maru incident. Many records of a long political career, split between the provincial level; as a BC MLA, attorney general, and premier; and the federal level in the roles Minister of Health and a member of parliament; document the years between 1979 to 2011. These records are wide ranging and diverse in terms of their topics and functions. An extensive collection of scrapbooks contains contemporary media reaction related to Dosanjh's political and community work.

The fonds is arranged into six series: Media and Publicity, Authorship, Advocacy and Indian/South Asian Issues, General Correspondence, Provincial Political Career, and Federal Political Career.

### Physical condition

Materials are in generally good to very good condition. An effort has been made to remove rusting paper clips and staples, but many remain.

### Immediate source of acquisition

The fonds was donated to Rare Books and Special Collection at UBC Library by Ujjal Dosanjh in 2017.

### Arrangement

The records were acquired in unsorted boxes, therefore, there was a minimal level of distinguishable order. The majority of materials were loose papers whose content, in terms of topics and dates, were not representative of their physical order or their relation to surrounding records. Therefore the arranging archivist has provided the most of the fonds arrangement to increase ease of use by researchers.

Where there was an identifiable assemblage by the creator, the order was maintained. This includes records that were placed into file folders. Where there was a written file title, this title was maintained.

Conversely, if there was no title, the archivist created one based on the contents of the folder.

Weeding of reference material, particularly in the form of news clippings and duplicate records, was necessary given the nature of their easy public availability, space constraints, and clarity of the fonds.

## Restrictions on access

Some files are restricted until January 01, 2068 as they concern third-party privacy. Restricted files are identified in the file list for each series.

## Related material

RBSC holds an extensive collection of NDP related material. This includes material related to Dosanjh's anti-racism work, elections in Vancouver South and Vancouver-Kensington ridings. 66m of textual records and other material contained in the New Democratic Party of British Columbia fonds.

## Series descriptions

---

### Authorship

Date: 2002-2012 (date of creation)

#### Scope and content:

Series contains material related to a draft autobiography and to several planned but never completed biographies. Correspondence includes communications with publishers and discussions with numerous writers regarding the content of their writings and source material.

A notepad, handwritten in the 2000's by Dosanjh, provides a draft of an unpublished autobiography. Proposed titles include, "My Experiments with Exile," and "Crisis of Conscience." Communications with publishers regarding the autobiography are included.

Material related to several unpublished biographies, form bulk of the series. Correspondence with two authors, Lisa Crawford and Shari Graydon, are extensive. The latter provided Donsanjh with

numerous drafts, outlines, timelines, and questionnaires, to gather source material and feedback. The drafts contain many of Dosanjh's personal corrections and revisions.

Also included in the series are source materials in the form of historical newspaper clippings and early advocacy writings related to the life of Dosanjh.

Arrangement:

The material contained within the Authorship series was found spread across the numerous boxes received at the time of donation. It has been compiled by the arranging archivist from the mix of unsorted archival material and does not reflect the chronological or working order of the creator. Documents have been arranged by their relation to either Dosanjh's autobiography, working biographic projects, or source material.

**Advocacy and Indian/South Asian Issues**

Date: 1973 - 2011 (date of creation)

Scope and content:

Series contains records related to Ujjal Dosanjh's lifelong activism and advocacy for human rights, social justice, and Indian community issues. Topics touched upon in personal writings and correspondence address the struggle and exploitation of farm workers in Canada, an absence of immigrant services, death penalty opposition, anti-violence petitions, English as a second language challenges, racism, and the Canadian Charter of Rights and Freedoms. Advocacy for Indian and Indo-Canadian issues relate to the Foreign Exchange Regulations Act of 1973, the Komagata Maru incident, the Bombing of Air India Flight 182, and the Khalistan movement. Records relating to Dosanjh's involvement in Komagata Maru Foundation of Canada encompasses press releases, meeting minutes, incorporation documents, correspondence and other materials. His participation in the Government of Canada's inquiry into the investigation of the bombing of Air India Flight 182 is referenced by transcripts, personal notes, and correspondence. Early 1980s correspondence with Indira Ghandi is

noteworthy and covers foreign exchange regulations for Indians living abroad, religious violence, and state policy regarding regional instability.

A significant portion of the series relates to the Sikh Khalistan movement. Worthy of attention are writings and correspondence addressing the 1984 attack on the Sikhs holy site, the Golden Temple, and the assassination of Indian Prime Minister Indira Gandhi. Dosanjh's call for calm; rejection of extremism, communal violence, fundamentalism, and religious fanaticism; are described in many public press statements, hand written notes, published articles, and correspondence. Positive support regarding his moderate position are particularly evident in the numerous sympathy cards and messages he received in the aftermath of his 1985 assault and following his 2007 testimony at the Bombing of Air India Flight 182 inquiry. Conversely, confrontation opinions of Mr. Dosanjh from within the Sikh community are found in records of threats, and defamation lawsuits. An anonymous letter received by Dosanjh's wife stating, "We know how to shut him up, you tell him," is included in the series.

Two defamation lawsuits, one against Dosanjh and one brought forth by Dosanjh, are available. In the first, the World Sikh Organizations brought suit against Mr. Dosanjh and the Canadian Broadcasting Corporation (CBC) regarding comments made on the television program The National, which linked the WSO to violent Sikh separatists responsible for the bombing of Air India Flight 182 and the assassination of Indira Gandhi. Press statements, court proceeding records, statement of claim and litigation documents, police reports, contemporary news reports, and correspondence document the matter. In the second defamation case, Dosanjh brought suit against South Asian newspaper The Link and its editor for making false statements about his character. Correspondence and a copy of the published apology have been filed.

Records related to the Advocacy and Indian/South Asian Issues series in the form of correspondence and contemporary media articles may be found in the General Correspondence series and the Media and Publicity series.

Arrangement:

Dated records of Dosanjh's 1980's correspondence and writings remain in the order of the creator and as received at the time of donation. The creator had stored his records in folders with titles describing their contents, for example "Correspondence 1985." Thus, the arranging archivist has kept the material as they were, retaining both their creator supplied titles and their internal order. Conversely, in the case of files titled, "Writings and Correspondence – General," the arranging archivist has compiled these records from the mass of unsorted material. They do not represent a file created by the donor.

Records related to the Air India inquiry were found contained within two folders one marked as "Air India Testimony" and the other blank. The folders held a mix of documents related to the subject but were not arranged in a discernible order. The archivist has therefore arranged the records by their function in relation to Dosanjh's connection to the Air India bombing.

All Komagata Maru Foundation records were compiled from unsorted material and arranged by the archivist except for material from a ringed binder. These records have been kept in their original order.

## Provincial Political Career

Date: 1979-2001 (date of creation)

### Scope and content:

Series consists of records relating to Ujjal Dosanjh's early political career in the province of BC. Materials relate to specific campaigns for MLA, NDP leadership, and BC premiership positions in 1979, 1983, 1991, 1996, 2000, and 2001. Also included are a limited range of records generated as cabinet minister and attorney General of BC. Political flyers, memorabilia, correspondence, political statement, notes, memos, campaign platforms, and documents related to his overseas travels in the capacity as a BC politician are contained within the series.

Records detailing the 1978 Vancouver South election by Dosanjh and running mate Jim Duvall encompasses all material related to the campaign. These include writings, election materials, and related correspondence. Dosanjh's motivations and thoughts are outlined in speech notes, letters of intent, and news releases. Advertisements include professionally printed advertisement flyers, meeting notifications, NDP information booklets, and handmade campaign buttons featuring the face of Ujjal Dosanjh.

The material for the 1983 campaign for Vancouver South with new running mate Joyce Whitman contains advertisement posters, leaflets, and textual documents. These include Dosanjh and Whitman's

candidate nomination forms, election budgets, joint electoral statements, donor and canvasser lists, volunteer information, and handwritten notes regarding political vision. Reference material includes an academic article by John Wood from the Department of Political Science at the University of British Columbia which analyzes the East Indian electoral behaviour in the election in 1979.

1991 Vancouver-Kensington election material includes internal NDP correspondence, a plastic "Elect Ujjal Dosanjh" lawn flag, booklets detailing Dosanjh's election platform, budget documents, and an extensive list of donor forms and membership lists including a period address book dated from 1980 to 1991.

1996 election campaign material is composed of campaign notes, flyers, fundraising tickets, donor lists and cheque copies.

Records detailing the 2000 NDP leadership campaign and 2001 BC premiership campaign are represented by platform and strategy notes, correspondence, delegate lists, media and advertisements, canvasser information, contact lists, and donor logs.

Congratulatory correspondence regarding Dosanjh's attorney general appointment, NDP leadership victory, and premiership ascendance are numerous and composed of messages from private individuals, corporations, organizations, and fellow politicians.

Records concerning a political scandal involving BC premier Glen Clark make up a prominent portion of the material related to Dosanjh's role as Attorney General. An interview transcript with Clark, correspondence, publicly released statements, personal notes, briefing packages, and search warrants make up the contents of the topic.

A collection of election campaign paraphernalia has been compiled spanning Dosanjh's provincial political career from 1979 to 2001. These include buttons, business cards, handouts, pamphlets, and leaflets.

Records related to the Provincial Politics series in the form of contemporary media articles and correspondence may be found in the Media and Publicity series and the General Correspondence series.

Arrangement:

Arrangement of the series is that of the archivist. The unsorted order at acquisition has given way to an arrangement guided by specific electoral campaigns, political roles, or major events. Low level sorting has taken place according to the function of materials. Where possible, the order of the creator's compiled material has been maintained. Such is the case of two booklets containing information used to obtain search warrants regarding the Glen Clark investigation.

Several miscellaneous and undated speeches were found in the vicinity of provincial political materials.

## Federal Political Career

Date: 2004 - 2011 (date of creation)

### Scope and content:

Series is composed of records related to Ujjal Dosanjh's federal political career while serving as a federal cabinet minister and as an opposition critic. The contents of the records relate to election campaigns, Minister of Health responsibilities, and a bribery scandal involving politician Gurmant Grewal.

Election materials correspond to federal elections held in 2004, 2006, 2008, and 2011. The 2011 election is only represented by correspondence detailing Dosanjh's loss and congratulatory messages about his political career. A general file includes a mix of miscellaneous records related to his federal career.

Minister of Health topics include: government health services, federal strategy to protect Canadian supply of safe and affordable prescription drugs in relation to internet pharmacies, American bulk import of Canadian prescription medications, and the defence of the Canada Health Act from provincial regulatory frameworks allowing private clinics to charge patients to jump the queue for medical services. Records are in the form of draft regulatory amendments, memorandums to cabinet; correspondence with MPs, members of the public, and American officials; committee reports, news releases, meeting summaries, speaking points, and briefing notes.

The Grewal investigation records includes numerous annotated transcripts, personal notes, media release statements, printed media reaction, word documents and audio files on a two compact discs, correspondence, and documentation of legal defence fees.

A collection of election campaign paraphernalia has been compiled spanning Dosanjh's federal political career with the Liberal Party. These include a name tag, business cards, handouts, pamphlets, leaflets, and posters.

Records related to the Federal Politics series in the form of contemporary media articles and correspondence may be found in the Media and Publicity series and the General Correspondence series.

Arrangement:

Material regarding the Gurmant Grewal investigation were located over several file folders spread throughout the boxes obtained from Dosanjh. There appeared to be little order, given the mix of documents and duplicates, thus the records have been arranged and sorted to better represent the subject and for ease of research use. Records contained within a three-ringed binder relating the Grewal investigation have been left in the order of the creator.

Minister of Health records are an exception to the general state of disarray of the records at the time of acquisition. Excluding the “general” file, all other Health Minister material maintains the original order of their respective folders. File titles have also been sourced from the original folders titles provided by their creator.

## Media and Publicity

Date: 1984 - 2010 (date of creation)

### Scope and content:

Series consists of an assemblage of clippings in 48 scrapbooks collected by Dosanjh and staff from local and foreign newspapers, magazines, and online sources. Individual items have been cut from their original source material and pasted into scrapbooks with date and publication data attached. A range of features including political comics, news articles, and opinion pieces document his advocacy and political career. Additionally, they present media reaction and opinions regarding various political decisions, announcements, and issues brought forth by the subject.

Clippings from two large Metro Vancouver print media establishments, The Vancouver Sun and The Province, make up the bulk of the pasted items. Smaller local publications and online news media sources such as The Georgia Straight, Global BC, and CTV News also feature.

Specific foreign language clippings form distinct compilations. Punjabi and Hindi news from local and Indian sources include The Indo-Canadian Voice, The Punjab Guardian, Des Pardes, Ajitweekly, Jagbani, Punjab Kesari, Daily Nawan Zamana, Chandigarh Bani, and Dainik Bhaskar. Chinese language papers are limited to Metro Vancouver based publications such as The Asian Star, SingTao Daily, Ming Pao Daily News, and World Journal.

Advertisements are compiled into standalone books. Dating from 1985 to 2009 and sourced from locally published newspapers, they relate to the promotion of Dosanjh's law firm, political election campaigns, and well wishes to members of the public regarding holidays.

Individual scrapbooks are identified by the date of their contents in day-month-year format.

Due to the nature of the scrapbooks' content, the clippings relate to topics found in the Provincial Political series and the Federal Political series.

### General Correspondence

Date: 1978-2015 (date of creation)

Scope and content:

Series consists of a variety of Dosanjh's correspondence relating to a wide range of political and private citizen topics. The communications are in the form of letters, greetings cards, printed emails,

cardstock invitations, booklets pertaining to events and ceremonies, and certificates. Due to the nature of the series' arrangement, topics encompass miscellaneous material as well as those related to the following series: Advocacy and Indian Issues, Provincial Political Career, and Federal Political Career. General topics of concern are personal matters, holiday well wishes, scheduling plans, anniversaries, congratulatory messages, attendance appreciations, invitations, the bestowing of awards, certificates of participation, and discussions related to political matters. These include communications in the capacity as attorney general, MLA, premier, and federal Health Minister; to other politicians and members of the public. A sample of specific matters includes a 2007 heart attack, Punjabi language communications, and conversations with India based academics and politicians.

Arrangement:

The unsorted nature and general disarray of the records at the time of acquisition resulted in many examples of correspondence discovered loosely filed in all locations with no sense of order. This consisted of numerous individual papers containing no intellectual relationship to their original physical surroundings. Thus, the archivist has had to compile large amount of material into a general correspondence series given the huge array of topics and time periods. Low level arrangement and sorting is an impossible task due to the time required to assess individual items for content.

Where small assemblages existed, the archivist has maintained these distinctions. For example, the files listed "Dosanjh general correspondence," are how they were received and continue to exist in the original chronological order of the creator. A grouping of documents referred to as the "India File" by its creator, has remained an intact entity within the series. These records date from 2000 to 2001 and contain correspondence with individuals and organizations typically located in India or related to Indian affairs. All other materials have been compiled from their various locations within the donor's unsorted material.
