

Victoria 14th February 1871

The deposition of Ah Sam.

On Friday last I went, balanced
in Cormorant Street, about South
Ah Son - I gave my brother \$300⁰⁰
to go home. Ah Son keeps a gambling
house and lost \$375⁰⁰ when
my brother lost \$375⁰⁰. I saw money
on the table and put my hands
upon it. We, Ah Son and myself
had a fight about it. I got a long
knife which they cut tobacco with. Ah
Son had a knife too. He cut me and
I cut him. I don't know which
first. Then went to the Police
Officer and laid a complaint.

There were four or five Chinamen
with him - their names were all
Ah Lucy, Ah Lou, Long Chaw,
Am Chaw and Ah Kee and four
or five men I forgot their names.
Ah Lou wanted to take \$25⁰⁰ and
I would not let him have it. I
caught hold of him by his hand -
he put the money which he had, I
told him he had no business with
the money because it was a subscription
money.

Subscription money is money
subscribed payable the sick man
to go home -

Long Chaw & Ah Kee went round
but subscription money -

Long Chaw put the money on
the table.

The sick man is Ah Lucy -

My brother was the sick man

I went round the Counter and
told Ah Lou he must put back the
money

When I went round the Counter
Ah Lou kicked me. Then I took
up a knife -

It was along think they cut blades

Ah Son got a knife. I don't know which got a knife first - the knife produced is not the knife -
I had the knife in my right hand.

Ah Son had the knife in his left hand I believe -

I don't know what kind of knife Ah Son had in his hand. I saw him take the knife from under the counter. The knife was used for cutting vegetables with I believe. One end of the counter touches the wall -

Ah Son was standing in the corner near the wall.

I was cut in right leg above the knee

When Ah Son saw me get a knife he got a knife

I got a knife first -

I raised my hand to catch it
him -

He hit it back at me. I hit him and cut him -

Remember what I said with China man here before Mr. Pomeroy. I told the judge Ah Son keeps a gambling house -

Ah Son sometimes allows my brother the partner in his gambling house. Sometimes he hires two other hundred
