The Information and Complaint of *Frederick Turner*

of *Stooke* in the Colony aforesaid, taken this  
*Nineteenth* day of *November* in the year of our

Lord one thousand eight hundred and sixty *three*, before me,

*Augustus Pemberton Esquire* one of Her Majesty's Justices of

the Peace for the said Colony of Vancouver Island and its Dependencies, who being sworn upon his

Oath, saith *I was at Stooke on Tuesday the twentieth day of October*

*last - about three o'clock in the afternoon of that day, the wife*  
*of Longman the late Stooke Chief, came to me and told me*  
*her husband was killed*  
~~*Sayer had killed Longman wounded Taylor and a woman.*~~

*I went to the Camps and saw the body of Longman - he*  
*was just dead - he had been shot with a ball through the*  
*breast -* ~~*The Indian told that Sayer had been away to the*~~  
~~*woods -*~~

*From information I have received I believe Longman was*  
*shot by a half breed named Sayer - I am not*  
*sure whether or not there was more than*  
*one wound - I only saw one -*

*Sworn before me the day*  
*and date first before written*

Wallatt - a Saanich Indian Woman  
says

I was at Sooke nearly a month ago - I saw the prisoner Lazar with a gun - I saw the Chief - named Longman - exostituting with Lazar and endeavouring to take the Gun from him, and heard the chief ask the prisoner why he shot his friend - Joxten. Lazar replied - "I was drunk at the time and I do not know why I shot him"

After hearing that I left them together outside and went into my house -

Acheel a Sawmish Indian says

About a month ago I was going with some friends to Sooke in a Canoe - When I was some distance from the Shore near Sooke, I heard a musket shot - Shortly afterwards I landed at about half a mile from the Indian camp, and then heard another shot - I then, ~~went~~ went with my two friends by land to the camp and I there

saw a clootchman crying and near  
the clootchman ~~the~~ Longman the Chief  
was lying almost dead, and not  
able to speak. I did not see  
the prisoner Lazar present.

I saw two bullet wounds under  
Longmans breast where the bullets had  
entered and came out at the back

It is about five or six weeks  
since this occurrence took place -

I was in my house at the Camp  
of at Sooke. When I came out  
of the house I saw Longman lying  
on the ground dead. I did  
not see the prisoner ~~Lazar~~ on that  
day.

I saw the prisoner with  
a musket in his hand on that day  
and I asked him to give it to me.

Lazar replied, "There are no  
caps on it." He did not give  
it to me - This was before  
Longman was killed.

I saw Lazar go into the woods after  
he had shot Longman. I  
was in my house when he fired.

I saw Lazar take a musket
