Local 1 - negotiating team has met with University three times there are 15 people on the team and the University is hassling them union is presently asking that 11 people be paid to negotiate as of last Thursday all contract proposals have been voted on by the members in wages they are going for \$191 per month plus whatever increase CUPE gets they want parity with Clerk I and Assistant Technician Two weeks ago the University submitted the last contract to the AIB and the union make their own submission University wants to wait and see if last contract gets rolled back Union argues on the basis of sex descrimination that last contract is fine and this one will be too also going for increases in almost everything else in contract no Vice-President yet - Pat Gibson and Judy Wright are nominated Contract is up Sept. 30th

Local 2 - decision made by LRB on Grade 11 and 12 people University had previously signed a letter of agreement to give these people a retroactive settlement now there is discussion about inclusion of student assistants in unit people on grants are not in unit but have seniortiy if they are put in unit meetings are now being organized with student assistants there is an impending strike by the poly party their contract was up in April they want parity with UBC which is 10 1/4% plus 35 hour work week University is refusing them Union feels they are being especially tough with poly party to intimidate us

college offered a 3 year contract, a new category for some workers at \$3.50/hour
