will you be kind enough to inform us, first, whether it is necessary or advisable to get a certificate from you covering the shipments accord likely to be, or whether when such supplies are brought in for relief purposes there is a possibility of them being admitted duty free; third, the best method of sending money to Germany at the present time.

> The shipment will probably consist of 5 lbs. of Condensed Milk, 2 lbs. of Coffee, 2 lbs. of Cocoa, 1 1b. of Tea and 1/2 1b. of Chocolate. In other words, it will be small enough to be shipped in one eleven pound parcel.
