I beg to acknowledge receipt of your letter of November 12th - File No. 25011-A --  
In my letter to Dr. Shellen of January 3d 1933 /  
In reply I beg to say that I have received no information from my Government which would have the effect of changing the information contained in my letter of February 8, 1933.

In my opinion <sup>it will be in order for</sup> your Department should <sup>Canadian</sup> continue advising exporters that German customs regulations, also under the German-Canadian Provisional Trade Treaty of October 22nd, will be <sup>ly</sup> sufficient/complied with if invoices are furnished which <sup>containing</sup> give the information <sup>with data supplied</sup> quoted in the last but one paragraph of your letter.

I had upon instructions of my government explained in what ways the proof of original cost can be established.
