Whereas, *Harry, an Indian* was this day charged before me,
Mr. Justice one of Her Majesty's Justices of the Peace in and for the said
Colony of *British Columbia* and its Dependencies, on the oath of *Mrs. Sar Kolar*
of *Chemamus* and others, for that *He the said*
Harry, on the seventeenth day of March in the
year of Lord One thousand eight hundred and seventy
one, at Chemamus, in the aforesaid Colony, did
willfully, and feloniously, shoot at an Indian woman
named Sit Sar Culawit, with intent to kill, or
do her some bodily harm.

These are therefore to command you, the said Constable of Victoria, to take the said *Harry*
and him safely to convey to the Common Gaol at Victoria aforesaid, and
there to deliver him to the keeper thereof, together with this precept; and I do hereby command you the said
keeper of the said Common Gaol to receive the said *Harry*
into your custody in the said Common Gaol and there safely keep him until he shall be thence delivered by
due course of law.

March in the year of our Lord *one thousand eight hundred*

at Victoria, in the *Caribbean* Colony aforesaid.

THE INFORMATION AND COMPLAINT of *Suc sar kalua, an Indian*
of *Chemarus*, taken this *Sixth* day of *March*
1871, before the undersigned, one of Her Majesty's Justices of the Peace in and for the said Colony
of British Columbia and its Dependencies, who, being duly sworn, upon oath deposeseth saith:—

On the sixteenth day of February last, Two Indians
named Harry, and Peter, of Quamichan, came to my
house at the Siskameen Ranch near Chemarus, An
Indian woman had brought some Whiskey from Victoria
to the Ranch, I had some Whisky, the two Indians, Harry
and Peter, had some also, Next morning Harry, and
Peter, got into their canoe to go home, An Indian, named
Sit Sar Cum, went out of the house and took hold of
their canoe, Harry, then struck Sit Sar Cum, with the
butt end of a gun and knock'd him down, I was
sitting in the house at the time near the door, My
wife hearing the noise went out to fetch her child
in, she was stooping down to pick her child up when
Harry, put a gun to his shoulder and shot her, My
wife fell down, I ran out and looked at my wife
and saw she was shot, blood was running from
her mouth, and throat,

information read, it is true, when I
saw my wife was shot, I took a gun
out of an Indians hand that was standing
near and shot at Harry, Harry and
Peter, then got out of the canoe and
ran away, I ran after them and
fired again, I hit Peter that time,
my wife is very much injured, she
cannot speak, she was shot with
a ball in the throat, I had no ^{quarrel} ~~quarrel~~
with Harry, or Peter, we had been
drinking all night, and were good
friends,

Se Hap-ton, an Indian of Chem-
-aino, being sworn upon his oath said,
I was at the Siskameen Ranch on the
Sixteenth day of February last, I saw
the two Indians, Harry, and Peter, there
they were drinking that night, The
next morning they got into their
canoe to go home, I saw Sit-sar-cum
go and take hold of their canoe,
I saw Harry, strike Sit-sar-cum, with
a gun and knock'd him down, he
also struck ^{him} again and broke the gun,
Harry wanted Sit-sar-cum, to leave hold
of their canoe; Sus-sar-kaluk's wife
came out of the house and was
picking her child up when Harry
put a gun to his shoulder and shot
her, Harry, was at that time about
12 yards from the woman,

Harry, and Peter, had two, or
three guns in their canoe

When the woman was shot she
fell down and cried O, dear, Harry
has shot me, I saw blood running
out of the woman's mouth; Mrs. Mrs. Baker
came out of the house and took a gun
from an Indian that was standing
near and shot at Harry, Harry, and
Peter then got out of their ^{course} and ran
away. Mrs. Mrs. Baker, ran after
them and shot again
