INTRODUCTION

Alfred Myrick Pound was born on May 7, 1869, at Margate, Prince Edward Island. In his early twenties he dropped his legal studies in order to join the staff of the St. John Telegraph. Around the turn of the century he left for the West, settling in Vancouver. In 1901 he went into law partnership with a Mr. Champion under the firm name Champion & Pound.

Nine years later he and Thomas B. May organized the Sterling Trust Company of British Columbia. Pound was also active in other areas of business and was a member of many clubs and organizations. He died in Vancouver in December, 1932.

Throughout his life Pound was interested in all aspects of Canadian Literature. Often he would give generously of his time and money to help Canadian authours. He was a member of the Canadian Authors' Association, the Vancouver Poetry Society, and the Vagabond Club.

Pound himself was not a prolific writer. Only occasionally did he contribute articles to a newspaper or magazine. Almost always, these articles were of a biographical nature. He also did reviews, but his comments were often lacking depth because his enthusiasm often made it impossible for him to criticize.

His library was one of the best private collections in Canada.

His postry section was especially good, as he specialized in collecting the works of his lifelong friends, Bliss Carman and Charles G.D. Roberts. Pound held Carman in very high esteem. Indeed, his papers contain a wealth of articles on, and poetry by, both Carman and Roberts.

The collection was presented to the U.B.C. Library in October, 1945 by Mr. Pound's three daughters.

The Pound papers have been divided into four groups. The first group of papers concern A.M. Pound. They contain his letters, addresses, and criticism. Also included are biographical sketches of others written by Pound. The second group is composed in much the same way, only the subject of the papers is Charles G.D. Roberts. The biographical sketches are of Charles G.D. Roberts, not by him. The third group of papers concern Bliss Carman. The fourth group, General Collections, is a catch-all for things which do not concern the above men in particular, but do concern them generally. This group includes manuscripts of poetry and prose, newspaper and magazine clippings, scrapbooks, photographs, and miscellaneous other items. In short, one should not stop at one group when considering only one man as there may be information elsewhere in the collection pertaining to him. That is, the divisions I have made are logical, but, on the other hand, they are arbitrary and flexible.
