 forenoon, to be then and there examined by the Judge of the said Court, touching your  
 estate and effects, and the manner and circumstances under which you contracted the said  
 debt which was the  
 subject of the action in which the said judgment was obtained against you, and as to the  
 means and expectation you then had, and as to the property and means you still have of  
 discharging the said debt and as to the disposal you may have made of any  
 property. **And take Notice**, that if you do not appear in obedience to this summons,  
 you may, by order of this Court be committed to the common gaol
