In reply to your inquiry of March 13th, I beg to say that in transactions based on the German-Canadian Trade Agreement, a certificate signed by the exporter on the invoice to the effect that the goods invoiced are of Canadian origin is, as a rule, accepted by the German customs authorities as sufficient evidence of the Canadian origin.
