having been duly sworn

the previous night, and that
they were only awakened by

questioned by the Magistrate.
There is not the least doubt
upon my mind but that they
murdered Ra-look-ah-Me
to prevent his telling anything
about the murder of the
Looking Glass family.

son-in of Mack-mopy-oh-ah-
me, & he had no doubt,
as is usual with the Indians,
been told by the latter of all
the circumstances connected
with the murder at Nanooce
Bay
