Victoria aforesaid make oath and say that the
said Robert Watson and George Watson were at and
before the filing of the said Petition and still lawfully
and truly indebted to me this deponent on behalf of
the Firm of Anderson and Company in the sum of
Four thousand Two hundred and Nine Dollars
for goods sold and delivered ^{money advanced and interest} by the said Firm for
which said sum of Four thousand Two hundred and Nine Dollars
or any part thereof I this deponent say that I have
not nor has the said Firm nor any Person by my Order
or on account of the said Firm or to my knowledge
or belief for my use or for the use of the said Firm
had or received any manner of satisfaction or security

Whatsoever sums or certain moneys ^{which are} owing by Robert
Watson and George Watson ^{to myself and his partner for the same firm}
