WHEREAS it has recently been revealed that the RCMP has engaged in such criminal acts as burglary and arson, illegal invasions of privacy such as unauthorized wiretapping, the use of confidential medical and tax records, reading of private mail and the bugging of union conventions;

WHEREAS of 419 breakins conducted by the RCMP since 1970, 402 cocurred in British Columbia,

WHEREAS the response to these revelations on the part of high ranking government officials, among them the Prime Minister, has been that only those with something to hide will insist on their right to privacy and civil liberty;
