Dear Mr. Rimmer:

Please accept my apologies for the lengthy delay in responding to your inquiry.

As far as I am able to determine your sister did not join the group life, disability or pension plans available at UBC. Therefore, the estate would not be eligible for any benefits. There are no other benefit plans i.e. union benefits or plans administered by the union. From the records we have in the Union Office it appears that Pauline worked in temporary positions as a floater for most of her years at UBC. People working on these terms are not eligible for these benefit plans.

In spite of the letter of January 7, 1982 from Miss Takemoto, no deductions were made from her paycheques (as per the copy you enclosed) for the pension, DI INS (disability) or GROUP INS (group life insurance). This would indicate to me that she did not join the plans.

Further, I have had AUCE members in the Benefits Dept. investigate this for me and although there is a copy of the January 7, 1982 letter in their files, Pauline was never enrolled in the plans. I have also double checked with the UBC Employee Relations Dept. They confirm that she did not join the plans.
