- 4. Discipline Inquiry/Complaints
 On October 11 a letter was received from Mr. Wicks, lawyer for 8 charged
 members, stating the complaints made to the LRB pursuant to Sections 79, 80
 and 81. Hearing was arranged at LRB for Friday, October 13. The charged
 members are alleging that AUCE Local 1 is also in contravention of Sec. 7
 of the Labour Code (for attempting to discipline them for refusing to
 participate in an 'illegal' strike).

Their lawyer is seeking from the LRB an order declaring that work stoppage was illegal and in contravention of Secs. 79, 80/81.

They are seeking a further order declaring us in contravention of Sec. 7 which would prevent us from continuing with disciplinary procedures.

Ann read Kerry Higinbotham's statement.

Ann, Michelle, Lid and Jean Priest attended the hearing, chaired by Mr. Bone, and also attended by Pam Woods (representing LRB), Wicks and Ron Sherring (for the accused).

Bone and Wicks urged postponement of disciplinary hearings.

Barbara Findlay offered this information:
The Code provides no protection for people honouring picket lines. The onus is on the individual (therefore, a moral decision). The dispute in interpretation centres on the word 'concert' in defining strike.

Nancy Wiggs cited a precedent involving Macmillan Bloedel and CPU and PPWC wherein Paul Weiler ruled that the Union was not acting in concert (with the striking union) and that the intend of not crossing their picket lines was not seen as engaging in an illegal strike, but rather supporting their strike. He did not consider this to be an illegal strike.

(Nancyscounsel states that the act of taking a vote in support of a strike is irrelevant to the issue of concert, since it does involve the striking union).

Nancy has stated she will not withdraw charges against the remaining three - Toby Moyls, Kerry Higinbotham and Valerie Pusey.

Michelle McCaughran Myra Christianson that we consult Barbara again.

that we ask her to contact Nancy's counsel,
