In re William Culverwell a Bankrupt.

I Thomas Roper of Victoria Vancouver Island
Clothes maker oath and say

- 1 That some months since I borrowed or took up at
Interest of William Culverwell the Bankrupt above
named ~~under oath and under~~ the sum of six hundred
dollars for which promissory notes were given and
which were from time to time renewed all of such
promissory notes being payable at the Bank of
British North America in Victoria aforesaid and as
a further or collateral security for the said sum of
six hundred dollars I deposited the Title deeds of
and relating to ^{certain Real Estate and} ~~the said~~ Property in British Columbia
with the said William Culverwell
- 2 That at the time of the adjudication of Bankruptcy
against the said William Culverwell promissory notes to
the amount of four hundred dollars on account of the
said original sum of six hundred dollars were then
running and outstanding and which have since become
due and payable.
- 3 Since the said adjudication I have been called
upon to pay to the Bank of British North America
the said sum of four hundred dollars, and which
amount is all I owe on the several Promissory notes
given by me to the said William Culverwell having paid
him the sum of Two hundred dollars on account.
- 4 Lastly That the said Title deeds are now as I am
informed and believe in the custody or possession of the
creditors or Trade Assignees of the said Bankrupt.
