NO GERMAN EXHIBIT FOR TORONTO'S FAIR

German Consul-General Here Sent for Catalogue for Information Only

Contrary to the report received here from Toronto that the Germans were considering making application to the Canadian National Exhibition committee for space at the Fair to be held this year, it was stated by Ludwig Kempff, consul-general for Canada, today that Germany was not considering anything of the kind.

The report from Toronto stated that he had asked for a catalogue from the exhibition committee and this was taken there to mean that he would officially apply for space to exhibit German merchandise.

Ludkig Kempff denied that his application for a catalogue meant that Germany would officially apply for space at the exhibition for the showing of merchandise from that country.

"I only sent for the catalogue because I wanted to see what Canadian industries would be represented there," he told The Star. "It is the Canadian National Exhibition, and not an international one, according to its name, and therefore we did not consider exhibiting."

When asked if Germany would enter if permitted to enter by the directors of the fair, would she take the opportunity, Mr. Kempff stated that a was not likely as they had not intended to do so in the first place.
