± - I Thomas Earle of the City of Victoria Merchant one of the above named plaintiffs make oath and say as follows

- 1 - The above named John Drouit is indebted to me in the sum of \$193 for goods sold and delivered by me to him and he frequently promised to pay me that amount
- 2 - I verily believe that the said John Drouit absconded from Victoria in the month of June last in order to defeat his creditors
- 3 - The said John Drouit has no defence on the merits in the action brought by me and I verily believe that his application has been made with a view to defeat payment of myself and other creditors
- 4 - I verily believe that the said John Drouit has permanently ceased to reside within the jurisdiction of this Honorable Court.
