In reply to your enquiry of October 27th, I beg to say that Christmas presents as such are not duty-free.

Parcels containing food stuffs of a value up to 20 RM are dutyfree if the consignee is in necessitous circumstances. There is a possibility of having parcels delivered dutyfree to any addressee in Germany by making use of the services of the forwarding firm of Kuehne & Nagel, Coristine Bldg., Montreal, who will undertake to forward the parcel to Germany, to pay the duty thereon, and deliver it to the consignee. They would later collect their charges, as well as the duty expended, from you.

I am enclosing a booklet on Travel in Germany which contains the only road map that I have available for distribution at present.
