Dear Sir:

In reply to your letter of the 13th instant I beg to say that worn clothing is admitted duty-free into Germany. Furthermore, foodstuff (except coffee, tea and alcohol) of a value up to 20,- Reichsmarks can also be admitted duty-free if the recipients are in need and can prove this to the German Customs Authorities. I may mention that the importation of meat into Germany is generally prohibited.
