Dear Sir:

I wish to thank you for your letter of June 7th and am happy to learn that you will cooperate with us in the organization of our "Canada's Foreign Relations" Exhibition.

We are figuring on allotting the exhibiting countries a space of thirty-five by about fifteen feet.

If you will send us a valued inventory of the German exhibits, they will be insured against fire and sprinkler damage. We cannot be responsible for theft and other risks. If additional insurance is desired, this will have to be at the exhibitor's own expense.
