1. That I was on or about the twenty fourth

2. That after the said marriage I lived and
cohabited with my said wife at Metlakatla
aforesaid, but I and my said wife have had
no issue of our said marriage.
3. I am informed and verily believe that
in the month of September One thousand Eight
hundred and seventy eight and at other
times between that month and the month of
December One thousand eight hundred and seventy
Eight the said Louisa Lequeneesh at Metlakatla
aforesaid committed adultery with Matthias
Haldane.
4. I am informed and verily believe that
on and during the months of September, October,
(1) November

November and December One thousand eight hundred and seventy eight the said Matthias Haldane frequently visited the said Louisa Lequeuesh and on divers such occasions committed adultery with her.

That no collusion or connivance exists 5
between me and my said wife.

1881 before me having first

seemed perfectly to understand
the same and made his mark
thereto in my presence.
