TARIFF CHANGE BY ORDER IN COUNCIL

By Order in Council (P.C. 2060), dated the 25th August, 1937, passed under the authority of Section 284 of the Customs Act, the following regulation is made and established:

REGULATION

The following goods, when imported to be used as materials in Canadian manufactures, are subject to the reduced rates of duties of Customs, as hereinafter set forth, viz.:

"Petroleum lubricating oil, .8236 specific gravity (40.3 A.P.I.) or heavier at 60 degrees Fahrenheit, when imported by manufacturers of petroleum white oils of medicinal and technical grades, for use exclusively in the manufacture of such oils in their own factories, provided that the imported oil is to be processed with fuming sulphuric acid (20 per cent oleum) in such proportion that not less than 5 parts of acid to 100 parts of oil, by weight, shall be used.
