UNIVERSITY OF B. C. LIBRARY AND CLERICAL WORKERS VOTED THIS
WEEK IN FAVOUR OF STRIKE ACTION TO BACK CONTRACT DEMANDS. BY
A MAJORITY OF 85.5% THE ASSOCIATION OF UNIVERSITY AND COLLEGE
EMPLOYEES (AUCE) VOTED TO BACK THE NEGOTIATING COMMITTEE WHICH
HAS BEEN TRYING TO SIGN THEIR FIRST CONTRACT WITH THE UNIVERSITY'S ADMINISTRATION.

THE AUCE HAS BEEN GIVEN THE UNQUALIFIED SUPPORT OF THE FACULTY
ASSOCIATION, WHO WILL ALSO BE SEEKING CERTIFICATION AND A
CONTRACT THIS YEAR. IN A LETTER SENT TO PRESIDENT GAGE THE
FACULTY REITERATED THEIR SUPPORT FOR THE UNION. STAFF SHORTAGES
AND LACK OF APPLICANTS FOR OPENINGS ON CAMPUS HAVE CREATED
PROBLEMS IN MANY DEPARTMENTS.

ED SIMS, PROVINCIAL MEDIATOR, IS DUE BACK ON AUGUST 13 AND WILL TRY AGAIN TO REACH A SETTLEMENT.

MR. MACLEAN, SPOKESMAN FOR THE UNIVERSITY, HAS SAID THAT THE PROVINCIAL GOVERNMENT WILL NOT GRANT ADDITIONAL FUNDS TO COVER WAGE INCREASES.
