Dear Sir:

In reply to your inquiry of March 1st I regret to say that this Consulate General is prevented by existing regulations from giving authentic information on German customs matters. I would suggest that you send a number of the coupons in question to the German manufacturer who is to make and pack the combs for you. He could without great difficulty obtain the desired information from the competent local customs authorities by submitting samples of the coupons to them.

The question arises whether, in adding coupons bearing your firm to the combs, the latter would not become subject to the regulations regarding the marking of goods. (Made in Germany). I would suggest that you obtain definite information in this regard from the local customs office.
