Hearst was required under an order of the highest court of New York State, to testify in the proceedings. He admitted under examination by Guider that he personally had written the article sued upon. This was a fact of great sig nificance since it established Hearst's personal responsibl ty and shortly thereafter the remaining untried cases were settled for #125,000, and the total recovery, including judgements awarded in Poston, Chicago, and Washington, amounted to approximately a quarter of a million dollars, the largest amount ever obtained in libel proceedings in the United Stor es.

> Aligned against Guider in Boston was the famous Senator Jame A. Reed, of Kansas City. The case resulted in a recordbreaking verdict for Bonner, who was the Chief Official of the Federal Power Commission.
