British Columbia } 1. The Jurors for our Lady the Queen upon their oath present that Cowgackee otherwise
to wit } called Paul Sharpe on the first day of December in the year of our Lord one thousand eight
hundred and eighty two the Shop of Henry E. Crossdaile situate on the right bank of the
Neas River in the Province of British Columbia feloniously did break and enter and one pair
of blankets, sixty yards of calico one pair of drawers one coat one waistcoat and one pair of
trousers of the goods and chattels of the said Henry E. Crossdaile in the said shop feloniously
did steal take and carry away against the form of the Statute in such case made and
provided and against the peace of our Lady the Queen her Crown and Dignity.

2. And the Jurors aforesaid upon their oath aforesaid do further present that Cowgackee
otherwise called Paul Sharpe on the first day of December in the year of our Lord one thousand
eight hundred and eighty two one pair of blankets sixty yards of calico one pair of drawers
one coat one waistcoat and one pair of trousers of the goods and chattels of Henry E.
Crossdaile before then feloniously stolen taken and carried away feloniously did
receive and have he the said Cowgackee otherwise called Paul Sharpe at the time
when he so received the said one pair of blankets sixty yards of calico one pair of
drawers one coat one waistcoat and one pair of trousers as aforesaid then well
knowing the same to have been feloniously stolen taken and carried away against
the form of the Statute in such case made and provided and against the peace of our
Lady the Queen her Crown and Dignity.
