of Vancouver Island

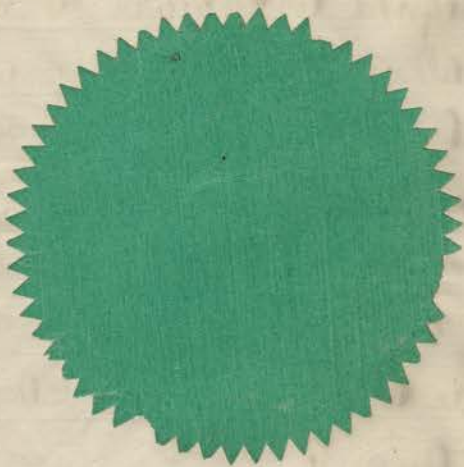
Greeting

I a Justice of Our Lady the  
Queen assigned to enquire hear and  
determine all Sleasons & Crimes  
Misdeds, Offences and Injuries  
Whatsoever And Wheresoever  
within the said Colony committed  
and also to deliver all the Gaols  
and every the Gaol of Our Lady  
the Queen and so forth

On behalf of Our Lady the Queen I Command  
You that You omit not by Reason of Any  
Liberty within Your Bailwick but that  
You enter the same and come to come  
before me at a Court to be held on Monday  
the Twentieth day of February a<sup>d</sup> 1866  
at the hour of Ten of the Clock in the  
forenoon at the Court House James Bay  
Twenty three good and lawful Men of Your  
Bailwick then and there to enquire present  
do and perform all and singular such things  
which on behalf of Our said Lady the Queen  
shall be enjoined them. And also a sufficient  
Number of Companion Jurors for the trial of  
All issues to be then and there tried before me  
Also that You make known the same



To all Coroners, Keepers of Gaols and Houses  
of Correction within Your Bailiwick that they be  
then and there to do those things which by  
Reason of their Offices shall be to be done  
And as you be there there to do and execute  
those things which belong to your Office and  
have you then there as well the Names  
of the Jurors aforesaid as also this present  
Given under my hand and  
the Seal of the Supreme Court  
of Civil Justice at Victoria  
Aforesaid this 15<sup>th</sup> day of  
February in the Year of Our  
Lord One thousand eight hundred  
and Sixty six and in the  
Twenty ninth Year of the  
Reign of Our Sovereign Lady  
the Queen
