In the matter of George
Watson, Robert Watson and William J.
McKinnon, bankrupts

I William Robertson of
Victoria, in Vancouver Island, Juicer, do
hereby make oath and say, as follows,

1- That the said George Watson
Robert Watson and William J. McKinnon
against whom a petition for adjudication
of bankruptcy hath been lately filed
and is now being proceeded
were, at and before the filing of the said
petition, and still are justly and truly
indebted to me in the sum of fifteen
~~seventeen hundred and fifty two dollars~~
and ninety three dollars and ninety
one cents, the balance due to me for
work and labour done by me for
the said bankrupts, as shown by the
account hereto annexed, marked
"A."

2. That on the 5th day of July 1865
I presented my account ^{against the said bankrupts} then amounting
to eighteen hundred and fifteen dollars
and forty four cents, to George Watson
above named, and received from him
the latter account annexed marked "B."

3 I have not, nor hath any person by my order, to my knowledge or belief for my use, received any satisfaction or security whatsoever, save and except the promissory notes herein after mentioned that is to say -

2 May 1 - 1865 Matthew Humphrey Robert Wafford \$1000, 150 days after date.
 Also a note against a Mexican for the sum thereon of \$62.⁵⁰ No particulars

of which I do not recollect having collected. I have credited the amount of the same & delivered up the note. I have credited the amount of the bill of particulars ^{attached} as collected & secured. The said notes were given to me with the understanding that if I succeeded in collecting the money due upon them, I was to apply the same on my account against the bankrupts

but in no event. The said bankrupts have I believe a claim against me for board - but for what amount I do not know. They never rendered any bill thereof to me -
