Charley Judson charged with stealing
a quantity of wearing apparel and
sundry other articles value about
seventy five dollars on Saturday
18th inst.

Alexander Myers deposes that he
call^d Charley who was his servant
to come and light his fire but not
answering I went into his house which
is a detach house on my own premises
and seeing a pair of new shoes on a
box I look into his box and saw
a quantity of goods which had been
taken out of my store consisting of
Trousers Boots while examining
the goods the prisoner and his
woman came in when I asked for
the key of the trunk which now
is in court when they refused to give
it up and said there was nothing
in it I then broke it open and
found two shawls and stockings
I then order^d him to light the fire
& took the goods into the house
and when I went back to the yard
he was gone I then gave information
to Stewart of the robbery

Stewart arrested
proved the arrest of prisoner
on the Atanacum river Camp of
Sunday night 19th April 1874

Charley the prisoner being questioned stated
that he had not received any wages
for four months & that he had no clothes.
