INTRODUCTION

The papers were transferred to the Special Collections Division by Anna Cecile Scantland Lund in March of 1977, and in several subsequent shipments. C.A. Lund is a teacher and novelist living in Kelowna, B.C.

SCOPE AND CONTENTS

Because new material is continually being added to the Anna Cecile Scantland Lund Collection, it has become difficult to keep a consistent system of series and sub-series in the inventory of her papers.

In this latest inventory of the Lund collection, documents and papers have been divided into two main series, general source documents (ie. all papers that do not appear to be Lund and manuscripts). The general source series have been further separated into topically distinct sub-series such as Japanese Canadians, minority groups, personal papers, etc.

Most of the papers in the general source series appear to be specific research materials for one or another of Lund's work, although this is not always clearly indicated. When a set of general source documents seem to be connected to a written work, such as Resignation, or Study of Historical Injustice to

Japanese Canadians, this is indicated in parentheses.

In the initial and subsequent inventories on Anna Scantland Lund, Boxes 2, 4, 5, 12, 13, 15, and 17 have not been accounted for. To make access easier, those boxes have been eliminated and their contents have been included in the addenda. This new series begins with Box 19.
