# ARTHUR MAYSE, 1912 -

An Inventory of His Papers in The Library of the University of British Columbia Special Collections Division.

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Arthur William Mayse was born on the Peguis Indian Reserve, Manitoba, the son of a baptist missionary, on October 23, 1912. He lived in various locations throughout the Canadian prairies until, at age seven, he found a permanent home on the coast of British Columbia. Mayse attended high school in Nanaimo and Vancouver and, later, spent three years at the University of British Columbia. During his university summers, Mayse worked at a lumber camp in Menzies Bay, B.C.. He left university in 1935 without completing his degree, but, nevertheless; began his journalism career with the <u>Vancouver Daily Province</u> newspaper as reporter, copy-reader, and sub-editor. In 1941, Arthur Mayse moved to the <u>Vancouver Sun</u> and became a reporter and columnist; focusing on outdoor events. It was during this stint that he covered, first hand, the premiere climbing expedition up Mount Waddington.

In 1944, Mayse, and his wife of four years, Winifred Annie (Davey) moved to Toronto, where Mayse became Associate Editor of Trade Magazines for Maclean-Hunter Publishing Company. In 1945, Mayse moved on to become Fiction Editor for <u>Maclean's</u> magazine until, in 1947, he quit his career in the editorial field to devote himself to his writing. Soon after this change, in 1952, Mayse, his wife, and their two children, Ronald and Susan, moved back to British Columbia, settling near Victoria, Vancouver Island.

Arthur Mayse's career as a writer began at the age of twelve when he sold his first short story to the Toronto Star Weekly. Although this early success seemed promising, Mayse wrote another eighty pieces before any of his fiction work was again accepted for publication. From the 1940's to the 1960's, Arthur Mayse enjoyed good success with his fiction, selling over a hundred stories to established American and Canadian publications. In 1949, Mayse gained some notoriety for selling a serial, Perilous Passage, for fifteen thousand dollars to the Saturday Evening Post, a record sale for a Canadian author at that time. In addition to his large quantity of published magazine work, Arthur Mayse has also written three published novels, Perilous Passage (1949), The Desperate Search (1952), and Morgan's Mountain (1960). One of his most popular stories, The Desperate Search, was also published by The Saturday Evening Post in serial form and, later, made into a motion picture by MGM.

In the few decades following his success, Arthur Mayse began to wind down his career in freelance magazine work and, in 1960, re-entered journalism, working as staff columnist at the <u>Victoria</u> <u>Times</u>. In the 1960's and 1970's Mayse contributed to numerous western newspapers, including the <u>Edmonton Journal</u> and the <u>Campbell River Upper Islander</u>; when the Mayses moved again, from Victoria to Campbell River, B.C.. It was not until the late 1970's that Arthur Mayse attempted to write for television but once he began, he was, again, successful in the endeavour. During the 1970's and 1980's, Mayse, in collaboration with his wife Win, wrote and sold approximately forty scripts for the

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popular CBC programme "Beachcombers".

Arthur Mayse's works largely centre around the lives and events of people who make their living reaping the natural resources of the B.C. coast. The rough wilderness setting that the author gives to his stories have universal appeal, as is evidenced by the translation of his books into Swedish, Norwegian and Danish, as well as the enduring international interest in "Beachcombers".

Arthur Mayse is an avid fly fisher and outdoorsman. He presently lives with his wife at Stories Beach, near Campbell River, British Columbia.

#### SCOPE AND CONTENTS

The Arthur Mayse papers consist of c.a five metres of files, mostly kept in 13 cm boxes. The papers are divided into five main series: correspondence, manuscripts, Beachcombers, printed material, and research sources.

Arthur Mayse's correspondence has been kept together as it was found (in the files and envelopes he labelled). In general, Mayse's labels have also been kept unless there was a need for clarification. The correspondence, therefore, frequently If a letter or sheet is completely out of overlaps. chronological order with the remaining contents of the file, its presence is indicated in the file description. A11 correspondence in connection with the Canadian Broadcasting Corporation has been place under the sub-series of "Beachcombers", and not with the other business correspondence. Arthur Mayse's pay receipts and stubs from different employers are dispersed throughout the correspondence and other files. They are generally put at the back of the file and may be located by year.

When Arthur Mayse wrote a initial outlining idea for a work, he usually labelled it a "start". Mayse's "starts" are filed separately from the manuscripts, as this is how they were found. Manuscript "outlines", however, are filed with the manuscripts themselves. In all cases, a manuscript should be searched by title in both files.

As a writer, Arthur Mayse often created and edited three of four drafts before presenting a piece for consideration. His manuscripts, therefore, are often labelled with codes such as "Step One,[Two, Three]". These titles have been kept in the manuscript file descriptions and are indicated with quotation marks.

In addition to this collection, there is a transcribed interview of Arthur Mayse by Susan Mayse which is located in the British Columbia Provincial Archives.
