INTRODUCTION

The records were transferred to the Special Collection Division by Florence Stanton, in November, 1978. The material consists of the records of British Columbia Voice of Women, 1960 - 1978, and printed material created and gathered relating to their interests and activities.

The records have been arranged in order by activities and interests. There was no evident order in any of the files. The order has been established in series by type of material (minutes; correspondence; printed material; etc.) and within the series the breakdown is roughly by subject and chronology.

The Voice of Women is a democratic, non-partisan organization which seeks to unite women throughout the world. Founded in Toronto in 1960, VOW won widespread support. The Voice of Women is involved in two main activities - to promote better understanding between the people and to stimulate and inform public opinion about man's inhumanity to man. The movement has a personalized approach. Membership is open.

Introduction

The Voice of Women (VOW) is a democratic, non-partisan organization which seeks to unite women throughout the world. Shortly after VOW was founded in Toronto in 1960, branches arose in every province of Canada. The VOW attempts to promote mutual respect and co-operation among nations, to protest against war or the threat of war and to stimulate and inform the general public. Membership is open and the VOW has acquired widespread support. The members have felt that the cause of world peace could be helped by personal contact.

The first accession of the British Columbia Voice of Women (BC VOW) records was received from Florence Stanton in November, 1978. An Inventory of the earlier accession has been prepared by E. Lederer, December 1978. A second group of records were transferred to the UBC Special Collections by Stanton in October 1979. The following records constitute the Addendum which begins with Box 9.

The records have been arranged in order by activities and interests. 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Introduction

Founded in 1960 in Toronto, the Voice of Women (VOW) is a democratic, non-partisan organization which seeks to unite women throughout the world. The VOW protests against war and tries to promote better understanding among people. Membership is open.

The first accession of the British Columbia VOW records was received from Florence Stanton in November 1978. Two addenda were later received and the current addenda were transferred to Special Collections by Florence Stanton in October 1980.

The third addendum (Box 13) contains the papers of the B.C. VOW covering the years 1978 - 1980 and printed matter related to their interests and activities. Some of the records had been arranged in subject series. These have been retained.

The fourth addendum (Box 14) consists of the papers of Joan Wright, president of the B.C. VOW 1961 - 1962, and printed matter relating to the interests and activities of the B.C. VOW for the years 1960 - 1974.
