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FONDS DESCRIPTION

Stevens, Homer. – 1923-2002.

Homer Stevens fonds. – **1939-2001** predominant 1960-1979.
262 cm textual records and other material.

Biographical sketch:

Homer Stevens was born on August 2, 1923, at Port Guichon, near Ladner, British Columbia. He began fishing on the Fraser River as early as 1936, at 13 years old. He began work as a full-time union organizer for the United Fishermen and Allied Workers Union in 1946, and was elected secretary-treasurer of that organization two years later, a position he held until 1970. Stevens was known for his steadfast role in this union, as well as for his affiliation with the Communist Party of Canada, and he was heavily involved in the fisheries on both the Pacific and Atlantic coasts. In 1967 was prosecuted for criminal contempt of court while involved in a labour dispute in Prince Rupert, and subsequently spent a year incarcerated at the Mt. Thurston Prison Camp in Chilliwack, alongside UFAWU president Steve Stavenes. Stevens was later elected president himself, although he stepped down from that position in 1977, and returned to the life of a fisherman.

Homer Stevens married Grace, his wife of 54 years, in 1948 and together they had four children, a daughter named Barbara and three sons named Bruce, John and Nick. Homer died in October 2002.

Scope and content:

The fonds consists of textual materials, photographs, slides, negatives, sound recordings and memorabilia created and collected during Homer Stevens' career with the United Fishermen and Allied Workers Union (UFAWU), as well as in his personal life. The fonds has been arranged into six series according to subject matter: Personal, UFAWU, Mt. Thurston Prison Camp, Printed Materials, Ephemera and Memorabilia, and Newspaper Clippings.

Source of supplied title: Title based on contents of fonds.

Physical description note: Includes: 89 photographs, 2 audio reels, 3 negatives, 3 slides and assorted stickers, badges, crests, banners and certificates.

Arrangement: When discernible, original order and titles have been maintained by the archivist, otherwise the materials have been arranged in broad subject files and in chronological order.

Restrictions: No restrictions on access.

Finding aids: File list is available.

Accruals: Further accruals are not expected.

SERIES/SUBSERIES DESCRIPTION

Personal Series. – 1950-2000.

29 cm textual records and 3 photographs.

Series consists of records created and collected in Homer Stevens' personal capacity, and includes correspondence and subject files. There are also 3 colour photographs included.

Title based on contents of series.

Series has been arranged in chronological order.

Correspondence. – 1958-1983.

11 cm textual records.

Sub-series consists primarily of correspondence between Homer Stevens and his family, although there is also some general correspondence included.

Title based on contents of sub-series.

Sub-series has been arranged in chronological order.

Subject Files. – 1950-2000.

18 cm textual records.

Sub-series consists of subject files, including identification and membership cards for organizations Homer Stevens was involved with, mortgage and insurance papers, shipwreck claim papers, notes and a theatrical play regarding Communism (entitled "An Open Mind: An Indicated Road Toward World Peace" by Mike Milan), and other miscellaneous items.

Title based on contents of sub-series.

Sub-series has been arranged in chronological order.

UFAWU Series. – 1939-2001 predominant 1960-1979.

126 cm textual records, and other materials.

Series consists of materials collected and created by Homer Stevens throughout his career as a union organizer and beyond. Included are photographs, slides and negatives, subject files, correspondence, records from an internal filing system, records of the Fishermen's Survival Coalition, minutes, handwritten notes and notebooks, reports and submissions, information regarding two major union disputes (the Canso Strait Fishermen's Strike and the Prince Rupert dispute), and information pertaining to a union delegate trip to the U.S.S.R.

Title based on contents of series.

Series has been arranged primarily in chronological order.

Canso Strait Fishermen's Strike. – 1960-1998 predominant 1970-1971.

10 cm textual records and 2 photographs.

Sub-series consists of records generated during a dispute regarding union representation and unionization of fishermen in the Canso Strait area of Nova Scotia and Cape Breton Island, and also includes two colour photographs.

Title based on contents of sub-series.

Sub-series has been arranged in chronological order.

Correspondence. – 1947-2001.

15 cm textual records.

Sub-series consist of general incoming and outgoing correspondence related to union affairs.

Title based on contents of sub-series.

Sub-series has been arranged in chronological order.

Fishermen's Survival Coalition. – 1983-1984.

2 cm textual records.

Sub-series consists of records pertaining to the Fishermen's Survival Coalition, and includes newspaper clippings, minutes, reports, policy papers, news releases and general correspondence.

Title based on contents of sub-series.

Sub-series has been arranged in chronological order.

Handwritten Notes/Notebooks. – 1950-1996 predominant 1960-1979.

20 cm textual records.

Sub-series consists of notes and notebooks handwritten by Homer Stevens during the course of his daily union work, and particularly when this work took him away from home.

Title based on contents of sub-series.

Sub-series has been arranged in chronological order.

Internal Filing System Files. – 1943-1956.

40 cm textual records.

Sub-series consists of records arranged according to an internal filing system of the UFAWU, and are ordered in agreement with a number stamped and initialed in the lower right hand corner of each document.

Title based on contents of sub-series.

Sub-series is arranged in original order.

Minutes. – 1951-2000 predominant 1952-1956.

3 cm textual records.

Sub-series consists of minutes from unions throughout Vancouver Island, the Lower Mainland of British Columbia, and Nova Scotia, and include general minutes and those from special committees and similar organizations.

Title based on contents of sub-series.

Sub-series has been arranged in chronological order.

Photographs. – 1939-1980 predominant 1960.

84 photographs and other materials.

Sub-series consists of 30 black and white photographs (plus 38 additional black and white photographs with an album), 16 colour photographs, 3 colour slides, and one strip of 3 negatives. These images were taken throughout the working life of Homer Stevens, but are predominantly made up of the union delegation to the USSR.

Title based on contents of sub-series.
Sub-series has been arranged primarily by subject matter.

Prince Rupert Dispute. – 1967-1970 predominant 1967.

4 cm textual records.

Sub-series consists of records generated during a dispute regarding fishermen in the Prince Rupert area of British Columbia, and includes correspondence, legal papers, credit reports and notes.

Title based on contents of sub-series.

Sub-series has been arranged in chronological order.

Reports and Submissions. – 1950-1998.

15 cm textual records.

Sub-series consists of reports and submissions generated by the United Fishermen and Allied Workers Union, the federal government of Canada, the provincial government of British Columbia and other institutions related to fishery matters.

Title based on contents of sub-series.

Sub-series has been arranged in chronological order.

Subject Files. – 1944-2001.

10 cm textual records.

Sub-series consists of subject files related to the activities of Homer Stevens' and the UFAWU, and include ... (WHAT?)

USSR. – 1959-1970 predominant 1960-1965.

7 cm of textual records.

Sub-series consists of records pertaining to a trip taken by UFAWU delegates to the USSR in the early 1960s and includes materials such as newspaper articles, reports, itineraries, interviews and other miscellaneous items.

Title based on contents of sub-series.

Sub-series has been arranged in chronological order.

Mt. Thurston Prison Camp Series. – 1967-1968.

79 cm of textual records.

Series consists of records pertaining to Homer Stevens' year-long imprisonment in the prison camp at Mt. Thurston, and include correspondences, prison publications, and subject files.

Title based on contents of series.

Series has been arranged in chronological order.

Correspondence. – 1967-1968.

65 cm of textual records.

Sub-series consists of correspondence written and received by Homer Stevens during the time he spent at Mt. Thurston Prison Camp (and several from Oakalla Prison, where he spent time before being transferred to Mt. Thurston). While primarily from his family and co-workers, there are also letters from union sympathizers and supporters from around North America. Some of the correspondence is addressed to both Homer Stevens and Steve Stavenes, and all enclosures have been kept with their original letters.

Title based on contents of sub-series.

Sub-series has been arranged in chronological order.

Prison Publications. – 1967-1968.

6 cm of textual records.

Sub-series consists of the prison publication *The Slesse News*, which features news articles, anecdotes about prison life, recipes, jokes, stories, drawings and other miscellaneous items.

Subject Files. 1967-1968.

8 cm of textual records.

Sub-series consists of subject files related to Mt. Thurston Prison Camp and include such things as ... (What?)

Printed Materials Series. – 1944-1995 predominant 1960-1970.

15 cm of textual materials.

Series consists of issues of *The Fisherman*, *Maclean's* and *Saturday Night* magazines, and other assorted publications.

Ephemera and Memorabilia Series. – 1959-1995.

18 cm of other materials.

Series consists of ephemera and memorabilia collected by Homer Stevens, includes such things as banners, stickers, crests, convention badges, certificates, sound recordings, and other memorabilia.

Newspaper Clippings Series. – 1960-1999.

10 cm of textual records.

Series consists of newspaper clippings from all across Canada, covering union activities and other miscellaneous topics.
