Introduction

Seamon Morley Scott was born in New Brunswick in 1896. His family moved to Vancouver while Morley was in high school. After WWI service, he attended the University of British Columbia, graduating with a History B.A. An M.A. was completed at the University of Toronto. Before settling in Ann Arbor, Michigan as a faculty instructor and PhD student, Morley spent a year studying at Oxford.

His career falls roughly into two twenty year periods. From 1922 until 1942, Morley pursued the scholar's life at the University of Michigan. During the war, he was seconded into the Department of External Affairs (although originally this was to be a temporary situation), which is the starting point of his diplomatic career. Morley represented Canada in London, Berlin, New Dehli, Tokyo, and Karachi; in addition, he attended three General Assemblies of the United Nations in New York, and taught two stints at the National Defence College in Kingston, Ontario.

Morley retired in 1963. From that time until his death he was active in his own private studies, most notably the beginnings of a Scott family history.

Guide to the Inventory

This accession has been divided into two sections: chronological and subjectival.

As the name suggests, the chronological section is organized with regard to Morley's academic and diplomatic careers. The accession moves along exactly the same way he did.

The subject section is comprised of more general categories, such as incoming and outgoing letters, and biographical and family material.

There is also a box of photographs at the end of the accession.

Additional papers relating to the Scott family history were donated in 1988.
