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FONDS DESCRIPTION

Title: United Transportation Union, Local 422 fonds.

Dates: 1919-86.

Physical Extent: 9.91 m of textual records. -- 40 photographs.

Administrative history:

Local 422 of the United Transportation Union (hereafter referred to as UTU), represents non-operating running trades trainmen in the Vancouver area. Before 1969, non-operating union staff were represented by two predecessor unions: the Brotherhood of Railroad Trainmen (which became the United Transportation Union in 1969) and the Brotherhood of Locomotive Firemen and Enginemen (which merged with the UTU in 1976).

Scope and content:

Fonds consists of records made or created in the course of practical activities by the UTU, Local 422. The fonds is organized into the following series: handwritten notes, printed material, and subject files. The fonds consists of the Brotherhood of Railway Trainmen sous-fonds, the Brotherhood of Locomotive Firemen and Enginemen sous-fonds, the Vancouver Joint Council of Railway Unions sous-fonds, and the Vancouver Rail Task Force sous-fonds.

Source of supplied title: Title based on the contents of the fonds.

Conservation: For conservation purposes, the records have been refoldered and reboxed in acid-free material.

Immediate source of acquisition: Fred Court donated the records directly to Special Collections.

Arrangement: Wherever the creator has arranged and maintained the records prior to deposit, this arrangement has been maintained and title headings have been kept. The records that were not organized by the creator have been organized so as to facilitate access and this is noted in the series descriptions.

Restrictions: No restrictions have been placed on access.

Finding aids: Available at the file list.

Accruals: Further accruals are expected.

Title: Vancouver Rail Task Force sous-fonds.

Dates: 1960, 1974, 1976-82, predominant 1977-82.

Physical Extent: 1.015 m of textual records.

Administrative history:

The Vancouver Rail Task Force (VRTF) was established in 1977, under the auspices of WESTAC, when the Government of British Columbia, the British Columbia Railway, and the VJCRU recommended at the Vancouver hearings of the Grain Handling and Transportation Commission, that a Task Force be established to improve the rail transportation system in the Vancouver Area. It lasted until 1982. Its objective was “to increase the reliability, speed, efficiency and safety of rail car movement through the Vancouver Terminal Area.” To do this, there was a project team created consisting of the Chairman, from WESTAC, a senior representative of railroad management, a senior representative of railroad labour, and one senior representative of the Federal Government.

The Vancouver Joint Council of Railway Unions (VJCRU) was initiated by UTU, Local 422 in 1972 as an umbrella group of shop and running railway trades. It looked after the general economic and political interests of trainmen in the Lower Mainland.

The Brotherhood of Locomotive Firemen and Enginemen was organized in Port Jervis, New York in 1873 under the name BLF. In 1906, the union changed its name to BLFE. In 1969, the BLFE joined with other unions to form the United Transportation Union.

Administrative history: The Brotherhood of Railroad Trainmen was founded in 1882 in Oneonta, New York by eight brakemen. Originally, the BRT was known as the Brotherhood of Railway Brakeman and changed its name to BRT in 1889. In 1969, the BRT joined with other unions to form the United Transportation Union.
