Lady The Queen then and there
being feloniously wilfully and of
his malice aforethought did make
an assault and that the said
Sealampton with a certain knife
which he the said Sealampton
in his hand then and there had

and held the said Peliagualar
in and upon the belly of him
the said Peliagualar then and
there feloniously wilfully and
of his malice aforethought did strike
and thrust giving to the said
Peliagualar then and there with
the knife aforesaid in and upon
the belly of him the said
Peliagualar one mortal wound of
which said wound the said
Peliagualar did die

And so the Jurors aforesaid
upon their Oath aforesaid do say
that the said Sealampston the
said Peliagualar in manner and
form aforesaid feloniously wilfully
and of his malice aforethought
did kill and Murder against
the Peace of our Lady The Queen
Her honours and Dignity
