INTRODUCTION

John Andrew Munro has written and edited significant works in Canadian history. Born in Calgary in 1938 and raised in Thunder Bay and Vancouver, he obtained a B.A. in 1962 and an M.A. in 1965 at the University of British Columbia. His thesis, entitled "The difficult art of Canadian foreign policy, 1957-1963," focused on decades that would feature some of his most interesting writing.

He taught at several institutions, including the University of Victoria, Columbia Junior College in Vancouver, and Selkirk College in Castlegar at which he chaired the Department of Social Sciences. After a year of doctoral studies at Queen's University, he accepted a position as resident historian in the Department of External Affairs.

In the same year in which he edited The Alaska Boundary Question (1970), he delivered a lecture on Loring Christie which so impressed the Rt. Hon. Lester Pearson, who was in attendance, that the former prime Minister asked John Munro to collaborate with him on his memoirs. Although Lester Pearson passed away while writing the second volume of the three volume work, Munro was able to complete Mike: The Memoirs of the Right Honourable Lester B. Pearson. Volume I and II of the Memoirs received the Albert B. Corey Prize in Canadian-American Relations for 1973.

In that same year he accepted the position as a consultant for the CBC series, "One Canadian", in 1973 which was on the life of the Rt. Hon. John G. Diefenbaker. He became the principle writer-historian of One Canada, Memoirs of The Right Honourable John G. Diefenbaker. Since that time John Munro has continued as a free-lance historian, writer, and editor as well as a period from 1978 to 1982 in which he was the first director of The Right Honourable John G. Diefenbaker Centre at the University of Saskatchewan in Saskatoon. He has edited published books on Jack Horner and John Diefenbaker, as well as preparing an unpublished manuscript on the Western Canadian separatist movement entitled, Prairie Fire. His latest book should be released in 1989 and is entitled Tai Tai: adapted from the China Diaries of Margaret Outerbridge, 1938-1950.

Scope and Contents

The John A. Munro Research Collection contains both material created by Munro and gathered by him in his areas of interest. It consists of approximately eleven metres with the major subgroups being composed of material relating to Lester B. Pearson (3.75 metres), Documents on Canadian External Relations (2.5 metres), Tai Tai (2 metres) and Henry H. Stevens (1.25 metres). Other smaller subgroups relate to other projects. Most of the material was already divided into subgroups by the donor upon its deposit. Within the subgroups the material was arranged into series (manuscripts, correspondence, subject files, interviews, printed material, etc.) and placed into alphabetical or chronological order as appropriate.

An attempt has been made with the Henry H. Stevens subgroup to note which letters are originals and which have been photocopied. The Documents on Canadian External Relations subgroups contains mainly photocopied material and the Tai Tai is original. The Rt. Hon. Lester B. Pearson subgroups were of major interest to the donor and contain considerable photocopying. There is not a similar amount of material on the Rt. Hon. John G. Diefenbaker as it was donated by John Munro to the Diefenbaker Centre in 1981. Much of the photocopying is from collections within the National Archives of Canada.

FONDS DESCRIPTION

John Munro fonds. — 1960-1996. — 12.45 m of textual records. — 2 computer disks. — 44 audio cassettes. — 3 videocassettes.

Biographical sketch:

John Munro has written and edited significant works in Canadian history. Born in Calgary in 1938 and raised in Thunder Bay and Vancouver, he obtained a B.A. in 1962 and a M.A. in 1965 at the University of British Columbia. He taught at several institutions, including the University of Victoria, Columbia Junior College in Vancouver, and Selkirk College in Castlegar at which he chaired the Department of Social Sciences. After a year of doctoral studies at Queen's University, he accepted a position as resident historian in the Department of External Affairs. In the same year he edited The Alaska Boundary Question (1970), he delivered a lecture on Loring Christie which so impressed the Rt. Hon. Lester Pearson, who was in attendance, that the former prime Minister asked John Munro to collaborate with him on his memoirs. Although Lester Pearson died while writing the second volume of the three volume work, Munro was able to complete Mike: The Memoirs of the Right Honourable Lester Pearson. In 1973, he accepted the position as a consultant for the CBC series, "One Canadian", which was on the life of the Rt. Hon. John G. Diefenbaker. Munro became the principle writer of One Canada, Memoirs of The Right Honourable John G. Diefenbaker. He was also the founding director of the Diefenbaker Centre, University of Saskatchewan from 1978 to 1982. As a freelance historian writer/editor, he has edited and written several other works.

Scope and content:

The fonds consists of records created and accumulated by John Munro in the course of his research and writing on the careers of W. A. C. Bennett, Gordon Churchill, David A. Croll, John G. Diefenbaker, Jack Horner, Derrick Humphreys, Carl Nickle, Lester B. Pearson, Henry H. Stevens and David J. Walker. It contains Munro's work on Canadian external relations, the Atherton railway accident case, the Alaska Boundary Dispute, Tai-Tai, the China experience of Dr. and Mrs. Outerbridge and material related to the publication of Beyond the Moongate. The fonds also includes the screenplays The Ribbon and Prairie Point both co-written by Munro, an unpublished manuscript on the Western Canadian separatist movement entitled Prairie Fire, and edited work for the Edelweiss Credit Union and Gordon Wilson.

Title source: Title based on the contents of the fonds.

Immediate source of acquisition: John Munro donated material directly to Special Collection, UBC.

Arrangement: Most of the material was already divided into subgroups by the donor upon its deposit. Within the subgroups, material was arranged into series (manuscripts, correspondence, interviews, drafts, printed material, ect.). Each material contained in the series have been listed to the item level. This information may be found in the content listing following the description.
