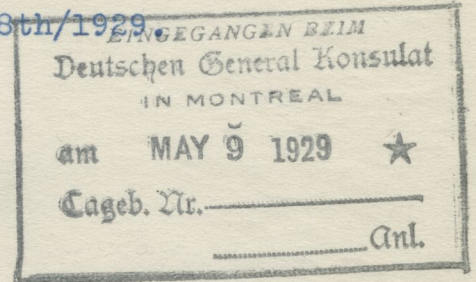

Dear Sirs:-

We have on hand in Montreal a Consignment of Hat Plushes which were originally forwarded by Johs. Girmes & Co., Oedt, to their Canadian Agent Mr. Vorsteher. These goods have been in Canada for some six years and as it is now impossible to dispose of them in this market our Principals who had transferred these stocks to us now have decided that they should be returned to Germany.

They advise that in order to get the shipment into Germany free of duty that they will have to prove to the Customs Authorities there that the goods were formerly shipped to Canada as a Consignment stock. We would therefore appreciate if you would advise us if in order to cover these requirements it would be satisfactory to have a declaration made by Mr. Vorsteher before a Notary declaring to the effect that the goods were imported from Girmes as a Consignment, and to his declaration we could attached a detailed list covering the piece number, quality and yardage.

In reply to your letter of May 8th, regarding a consignment of plushes to be returned to Messrs. Johs. Girmes & Co., of Oedt, I beg to say that it will be the addressee's duty to prove to the German customs authorities the identity of the returned goods. Messrs. Girmes' task will be easier if they can produce copies of the original customs invoices. It might also be helpful if Mr. Vorsteher makes a declaration as set forth in your letter. You will understand that the final decision as to what is necessary to prove the identity of the goods is a question exclusively for the German customs authorities.
