Dear Gang,

As you may know, the Canadian Labour Congress has finally agreed to organize a demonstration against the wage and price controls in Ottawa on March 22nd.

I'm not sure how successful they want it to be, since March 22nd is a Monday, and they're not calling for a general work stoppage ~ but be that as it may ~ it's about time they got off their butts.

If you will remember, when the legislation was announced, Local # 1 passed a resolution condemning the impending law, and supporting in principle opposition to the controls.

It is with this in mind, that I suggest at the next membership meeting we have an item on the agenda regarding the legislation ~ and that a motion supporting the demonstration in Ottawa be moved, either by myself or ~~the~~ preferably the Executive.

Further to this — the Vancouver executive of CUPW last night decided to again ~~push~~ move a motion at the Vancouver Labour Council ~~asking~~ instructing the B.C. Fed to organize a demonstration or meeting in all major cities in B.C. on Sunday March 21st.

They also said that if they're stalled or the idea is rejected ~ they will go ahead and send an open letter to all unions in

Vancouver (including ccu - and non-affiliates) inviting them to help plan the meeting or demonstration on the Sunday.

I think that we should also have a motion to support and encourage any protest by individual unions or the B.C. Trade Union movement here, specifically CUPW's ~~idea~~ proposal.

Also - how about an ~~standing~~ ^{ad-hoc} committee in our local on wage and price controls - now it's just individuals like me or Tom going to the BCTU's meetings - or Francis; having doing research - so we can work together - remember, the Socreds still have to pass their legislation, reportedly retroactive, and there is a STRONG (confidential) rumour that the Anti-Inflation Board has asked the University for a breakdown of our raises.
