#### SUPPORT A.U.C.E. LOCAL #2 - SIMON FRASER

A.U.C.E. Local #2 (Simon Fraser) is currently in the process of negotiating its first collective agreement. They have been out on strike several times and are currently in mediation (which the Union requested). If mediation is unsuccessful, they will have to strike again.

Because Local #2 has no system of dues check-off (until a contract is signed) and because it is in serious financial difficulty (what money it did have went to organizing the strike and aiding needy individual members to pay rent and buy groceries) Local 1 should [section K (2) of the local by-laws] agree to an assessment of \$5.00 per member. This \$5.00 would be assessed only if S.F.U. takes a positive strike vote and would be assessed only once. Just the knowledge that this donation has been approved by Local 1 would be enough to encourage S.F.U. to carry on confidently with whatever action they feel is necessary to get their collective agreement.

The money collected would amount to roughly \$6000. Local 1 should conduct this assessment not just because Local #2 is another A.U.C.E. local but because we at U.B.C. have to recognize just how deeply we are being affected by the situation at Simon Fraser and, consequently, the reasons why we at U.B.C. must offer assistance to Local 2.

I wonder how many of us at U.B.C. realize how fortunate we were last year in not being forced to strike? If the current situation at Simon Fraser is any indication of how we will be treated by U.B.C. this fall, what will happen to us? It is certain that U.B.C. is closely watching the negotiations at Simon Fraser and perhaps wondering just how well we at U.B.C. would be able to weather the tactics used by Simon Fraser. Granted, the administration at Simon Fraser has gone far beyond the realm of management's role in collective bargaining - the Administration seems bent on busting the Union entirely (remember the fight against the Staff Association to get certified).

Unless the clerical workers at Simon Fraser get monetary assistance for their members soon, it will be impossible to continue to struggle for a just first collective agreement. And unless we give Simon Fraser that support, not only will the workers at Simon Fraser lose, but we will too.
