In Bankruptcy

In re Alfred Robertson a Bankrupt.

We James Reid Robertson of Victoria Vancouver
Island Manager for Thomas Pattick of Victoria,
aforesaid one of the assignees of the Estate of the above
named Bankrupt and Robert Bishop of the
same place Attorney at Law Solicitor to the assignees
severally make oath and say as follows that is to
say

1 I this deponent James Reid Robertson for myself
say that shortly after the said Bankrupt absconded
in the month of January last I saw William
Lynns of Victoria Junkeper who had gone to
Port Townsend after the said Bankrupt and who
told me that he had seen Richard Doherty of
Victoria BAKER over there with the said Bankrupt
Alfred Robertson and what said Richard Doherty
is one of the clerks for the said Alfred Robertson and
that the said Bankrupt had given the said
Richard Doherty a Gold Watch and Chain and
money to make him safe as far as possible

2 I also say that the said Richard Doherty
informed me about a week or ten days since
that he had made off his Property to protect
himself against the claim which the Assignees
of the Bankrupt's Estate had made against

him on the Bond signed by him and
John Lemon

And I this other deponent Robert Doolop 3
for myself say that I was present with
the first named deponent James Reid
Robertson and heard the statement made
by the said William Lyons to the effect stated
and sworn to by the said deponent James
Reid Robertson ..

I further say that the said Richard
Doherty himself told me that he had followed
the Bankrupt Robertson and his wife to
Port Townsend to make himself safe but
that he had not got so much as he ought
out of the Bankrupt - This was said in
reference to the Bond given by the said
Richard Doherty and the said John Lemon
on account of Robertson's Bankruptcy
