STEERING COMMITTEE REPORT

We are fast approaching the end of another term, and our sign-up campaign continues. We are hoping to apply for certification for Local 7 before the term ends, but we still have a lot of work to do. Many of you have been approached to re-sign your membership cards -

unfortunately this is a Labour Relations Board requirement that manages to take up a lot of time and energy. When we apply, all membership cards must have been validated (with your signature) within the last 90 days.

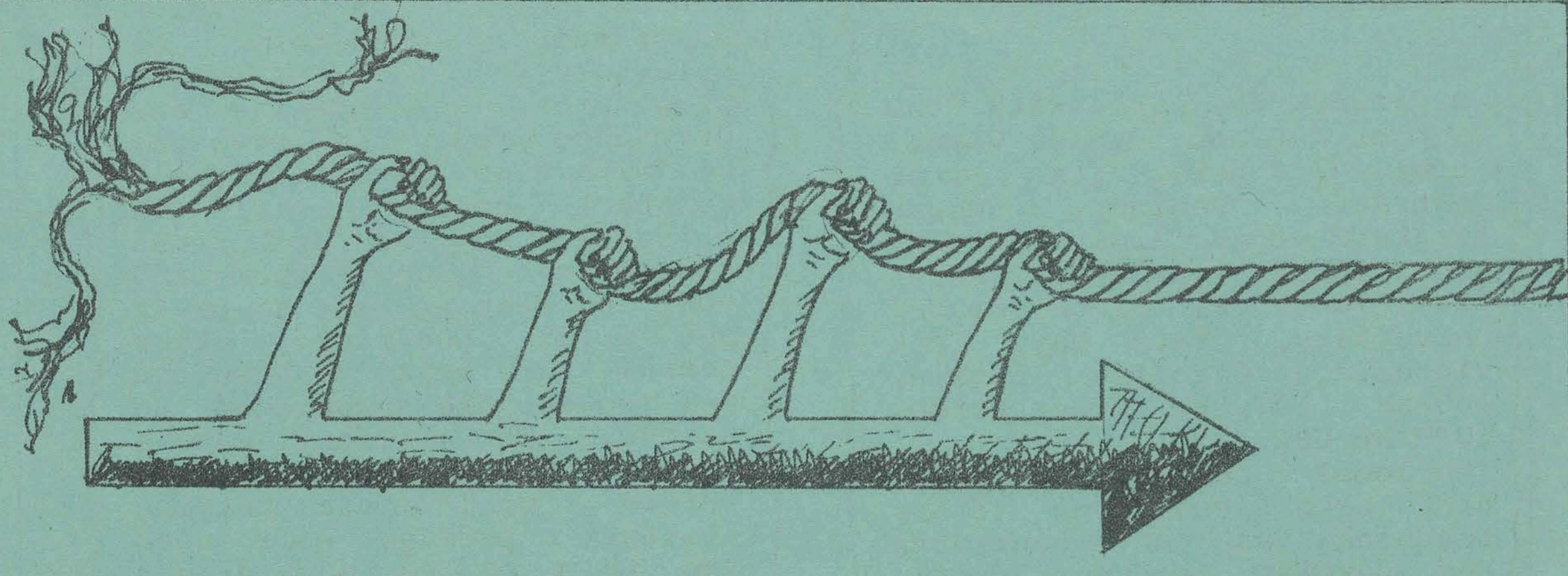
We cannot submit our application for certification to the Board until we have a minimum of 45% of our bargaining unit signed up. We are very close now, but potential members are getting hard to find. We need your help. Our application is only the first hurdle as we attempt to become a legally certified bargaining agent - it is not uncommon for the Board to take several weeks before reaching a determination regarding the appropriateness of the bargaining unit. Once that has occurred, they will order a representation vote to be held on campus, but only when the full complement of employees are present. This of course prohibits holding the vote during the summer, but contract preparations will take care of any free time you may care to give up. Our negotiations can begin within days after the vote is passed, so we want to be totally prepared.

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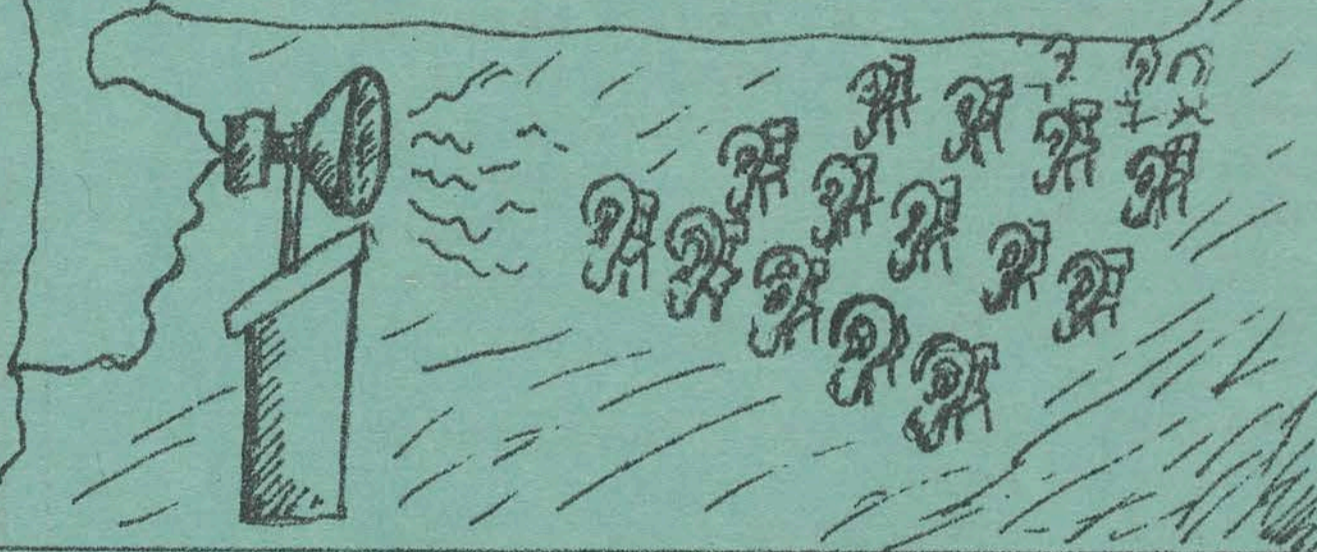

Our goal is to organize the 19,000 unemployed workers in the Victoria area in an effective and powerful political force. We have recently opened an office downtown in the Central Building, #202-620 View St., PH- 382-0411, which will be open from 10 AM to 2 PM Monday through Friday. CONTRACT COMMITTEE REPORT

On January 29, 1983, with the help of a Labour Canada Grant, Local 7 held its first contract seminar. Guest speakers were Carol Cameron, from local 1 at UBC, Stephen Gray, local 6, Simon Fraser University, Pat May, CUPE Victoria, Carolyn Laskin, labour lawyer, Mike Burke, CUPE at UBC.

The local 7 contract committee has been examining other teaching assistant contracts and putting together sample clauses to present to the membership for discussion. The speakers shared their experiences in negotiations and discussed the pros and cons of contract language options and strategies. Our local has to decide on how we want our union to be structured, and the

discussions on union membership (mandatory or voluntary), seniority procedures, job posting, and grievance procedures presented us with a lot of options. All contract options will be presented to the members so that we can discuss them and vote on what we want to be in our first contract. Other seminars are being planned and all members are encouraged to attend. The seminar was a great introduction, and the future work of putting together a package will need the help of as many of our members as possible.
