Dear Dr. Hickling:

In the matter of the labour dispute between AUCE and the University of B. C., we wish to clarify the following:

Any bargaining unit employees who are officially designated as 'on strike' (to date, this refers to Nancy Wiggs and Linda Todhunter) shall be absent from their jobs until an official change in status is communicated to you.

Further, according to article 17.01 of the collective agreement: "The University agrees that it shall not request, require, or direct employees covered by the collective agreement to perform work resulting from strikes that would normally have been carried out by those employees on strike." Therefore, if any employee refuses to do the work of striking employees, they are perfectly within their rights.
